## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the University of Wyoming and medical

2 education programs; providing an appropriation for

3 additional student participation as specified; requiring

4 studies and a report; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** There is appropriated from the general
- 9 fund to the University of Wyoming one thousand one hundred
- 10 dollars (\$1,100.00) to fund two (2) additional first-year
- 11 medical students in the WWAMI medical education program at
- 12 the University of Washington for the fiscal year commencing
- 13 July 1, 2005, thereby increasing class size from ten (10)
- 14 to twelve (12) students. The University of Wyoming shall
- 15 include in its budget request for the 2007-2008 biennium
- 16 sufficient funding to sustain the size of each class at
- 17 twelve (12) students.

6	(i) Explore the potential of expanding the WWAMI
7	medical education program by an additional eight (8)
8	students;
9	
10	(ii) Explore the potential of expanding or
11	subsidizing to a larger degree than current practice the
12	family practice residency programs in the state, including
13	alternative funding sources for those programs;
14	
15	(iii) Explore the potential for alternative
16	scholarship programs for medical students from this state;
17	
18	(iv) Report to the joint appropriations interim
19	committee not later than December 1, 2004, results of its
20	studies under this section, including the cost of potential
21	changes, the number of students affected and the number of
22	students likely to practice medicine in Wyoming as a
23	licensed physician as a result of each specifically

24 identified modification to a program.
