A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to pharmacists; providing that a pharmacist
2 may not substitute an anti-epileptic drug without consent;
3 and providing for an effective date.

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5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-24-148(b) and by creating a new
8 subsection (h) is amended to read:

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10 **33-24-148. Conditions for drug substitution.**

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12 (b) Except as limited by W.S. 33-24-149(b) and
13 subsection (h) of this section or when the practitioner has
14 clearly indicated substitution is not permitted, a
15 pharmacist may substitute a drug product with the same
16 generic name in the identical strength, quantity, dose and

1 dosage form as the prescribed drug, provided the
2 substituted drug meets all requirements specified in W.S.
3 33-24-147(a)(ii).

5 (h) A pharmacist may not substitute an anti-epileptic
6 drug or formulation of an anti-epileptic drug, prescribed
7 for the treatment of seizures, without the written consent
8 of the prescribing physician.

10 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2007.
