A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to fertilizer; modifying existing 2 definitions and providing new definitions; amending label
- 3 requirements; providing for registration of persons in
- 4 possession of ammonium nitrate or regulated ammonium
- 5 nitrate materials; identifying adulterated fertilizers; and
- 6 providing for a contingent effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** This act shall be effective only if the
- 11 United States congress publishes federal rules under H.R.
- 12 2764, Subtitle J, Secure Handling of Ammonium Nitrate or
- 13 its successor. The legislative service office is
- 14 authorized and directed to publish the provision of this
- 15 act in the manner which most effectively displays the
- 16 contingencies provided in this act.

2 **Section 2.** W.S. 11-14-118 is created to read:

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4 11-14-118. Registration of ammonium nitrate.

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6 (a) Any person who possesses ammonium nitrate or regulated ammonium nitrate materials shall be registered 7 8 with the department. The registration application shall be 9 on a form approved by the director in consultation with and upon the recommendation of the director of the office of 10 11 homeland security. The director shall charge an annual registration fee not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00). 12 13 Nothing in this section shall require the registration of 14 any person who produces, sells or purchases ammonium nitrate exclusively for use in the production of an 15 explosive under a license or permit issued under chapter 40 16 17 of title 18, U.S.C.

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(b) Ammonium nitrate and regulated ammonium nitrate
materials shall be secured to provide reasonable protection
against vandalism, theft or other unauthorized use.
Reasonable protection may include, but not be limited to,
ensuring that storage facilities are fenced and locked when
unattended, and inspected daily for signs of attempted

1 entry or vandalism to any storage facility. The director

2 in consultation with or upon the recommendation of the

3 director of the office of homeland security, may recommend

4 other security measures. The director shall work in

5 consultation with or upon the recommendation of the

6 director of the office of homeland security to provide

7 information to ammonium nitrate users on appropriate

8 security measures.

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10 (c) A distributor shall record the date of sale and
11 quantity sold, the valid state or federal driver's license

12 number, the current physical address and telephone number

13 for the purchaser of ammonium nitrate or regulated ammonium

14 nitrate materials. If the purchaser will apply the

15 ammonium nitrate or regulated ammonium nitrate material,

16 the distributor shall obtain the registrant's registration

17 number as a condition of completing the sale. A registrant,

18 if not a distributor, shall record the date of application.

19 All sale and application records shall be retained by each

20 registrant for a period of not less than two (2) years.

21

22 (d) Registrants shall comply with all federal and

23 state requirements regarding the dissemination of any

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1 information, providing the director and the director of the

2 office of homeland security access to the records.

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4 (e) For the purposes of this section:

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6 (i) "Ammonium nitrate" means chiefly the

7 ammonium salt of nitric acid. Ammonium nitrate shall not

8 contain less than thirty-three percent (33%) nitrogen, one-

9 half (1/2) of which is the ammonium form and one-half (1/2)

10 of which is the nitrate form;

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12 (ii) "Regulated ammonium nitrate materials"

13 means regulated ammonium nitrate material fertilizer

14 products which have been determined by the director in

15 consultation with and upon the recommendation of the

16 director of the office of homeland security to warrant

17 regulation based on the potential explosive capacity of the

18 fertilizer material determined by the ammonium nitrate

19 content.

1 (xxiv) "Secondary or micro plant nutrients" 2 means nutrients other than the primary nutrients that are 3 essential for the normal growth of plants and that may need 4 to be added to the growth medium. Secondary plant 5 nutrients shall include calcium, magnesium and sulfur. Micro plant nutrients shall include boron, chlorine, 6 7 cobalt, copper, iron, manganese, molybdenum, nickel, sodium 8 and zinc; 9 10 (xxiii) (xxv) "This act" means W.S. 11-14-101 11 through 11 14 117 11-14-118. 12 11-14-105. Label requirements. 13 14 (a) Any commercial fertilizer, soil amendment or soil 15 conditioner distributed in this state in containers shall 16 have affixed to the container a label setting forth in 17 clearly legible and conspicuous form the information 18 required by W.S. 11-14-104(a) and (b), the month and year 19 20 of preparation or lot number, and shall show the net weight 21 stated in both metric units and avoirdupois. In case of 22 bulk shipments, this information in written or printed form 23 shall accompany delivery and be supplied to the purchaser

Misbranded or adulterated fertilizer, soil conditioner or soil amendment; distribution of unregistered 3 4 fertilizer. 5 (a) No person shall distribute misbranded fertilizer, 6 soil conditioners or soil amendments. A commercial 7 fertilizer, soil conditioner or soil amendment 8 is 9 misbranded if: 10 11 (i) Its labeling is false or misleading in any particular way, including being labeled organic fertilizer, 12 13 when its use is not allowed pursuant to the United States 14 department of agriculture "National List of Allowed and Prohibited Substances" rule; 15 16 17 (b) No person shall distribute an adulterated fertilizer, soil conditioner or soil amendment. A 18 commercial fertilizer, soil conditioner or soil amendment 19 20 is adulterated if: 21 22 (ii) Its composition falls below or differs from 23 that which it is purported to possess by its labeling; or

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1 (iii) It contains unwanted crop seed or weed 2 seed; - or 3 4 (iv) A commercial fertilizer that contains 5 guaranteed amounts of phosphates or micronutrients, 6 contains metals in amounts greater than the levels of 7 metals established by the following table: 8 9 Metal ppm per 1% P₂O₅ ppm per 1% micronutrients 10 13 112 Arsenic 11 Cadmium 10 83 12 23,000* Cobalt 3,100 13 Lead 61 463 14 Mercury 6 1 15 Molybdenum 42 300* 16 Nickel 250 1,900

2 For fertilizers with a phosphate (A) 3 guarantee, but no micronutrient guarantee, multiply the 4 percent guaranteed P2O5 in the product by the values in the 5 table to obtain the maximum allowable concentration of each 6 metal. The minimum value for P_2O_5 utilized as a multiplier 7 shall be six (6.0); 8 9 For fertilizers with one (1) or more (B) 10 micronutrient guarantee, but no phosphate guarantee, 11 multiply the sum of the guaranteed percentages of all micronutrients in the product by the value 12 in the 13 appropriate column in the table to obtain the maximum 14 allowable concentration (in parts per million, or ppm) of 15 each metal. The minimum value for micronutrients utilized 16 as a multiplier shall be one (1); 17 18 (C) For fertilizers with both a phosphate 19 and a micronutrient guarantee, multiply the guaranteed 20 percent P_2O_5 by the value in the appropriate column. 21 minimum value for P_2O_5 utilized as a multiplier shall be one 22 (1). Then, multiply the sum of the guaranteed percentages 23 of the micronutrients by the value in the appropriate 24 column. The minimum value for micronutrients utilized as a

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1 :	multiplier	shall	be	one	(1).	Then,	utilize	the	higher	of
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- 2 the two (2) resulting values as the maximum allowable
- 3 concentration (ppm) of each metal.

- 5 (e) Any penalties resulting from violations of these
- 6 heavy metal standards shall accrue to the registrant of the
- 7 material that violates the heavy metal standard.

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9 11-14-115. Action for damages to crops; evidence.

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- 11 (a) Nothing in this act shall preclude the right of a
- 12 purchaser to bring an action for any damages to crops, land
- 13 or livestock by reason of misbranded, adulterated or
- 14 deficient fertilizer, soil conditioner or soil amendment.

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- 16 Section 4. Subject to section 1 of this act, this act
- 17 is effective July 1, 2009.
