A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to administration of government; modifying
- 2 procurement requirements for expenditures for capital
- 3 construction projects through the remainder of the fiscal
- 4 biennium; modifying and specifying preference requirements;
- 5 providing for waivers of the requirements; authorizing
- 6 modifications by executive order; providing for further
- 7 study; and providing for an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 **Section 1.** W.S. 16-6-1001 is created to read:

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- 13 ARTICLE 10
- 14 CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS

5 (a) Unless otherwise prohibited by federal law, any 6 funds appropriated or authorized for expenditure during the

7 fiscal biennium ending June 30, 2012, which have not been

8 encumbered or obligated by contract as of January 17, 2011,

9 for capital construction projects shall be subject to the

10 restrictions of this section which shall be construed where

11 possible as complimentary and consistent with other

12 statutory requirements relating to competitive bidding and

13 contractor preferences. To the extent the restrictions in

14 this section are inconsistent with other state statutes,

15 this section shall supersede all such inconsistent

16 provisions and shall govern. This section shall be applied

17 as follows:

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19 (i) This paragraph shall apply to any alternate

20 design and construction delivery method as defined in W.S.

21 16-6-701(a)(v):

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23 (A) All contracts shall require the

24 construction manager at risk or design builder to conduct

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1 an open bid process in compliance with Wyoming contractor

2 preference laws before awarding any subcontracts for work

3 to be performed for the project and before acceptance of

4 any guaranteed maximum price;

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6 (B) Unless exempted pursuant to

7 subparagraph (C) of this paragraph the construction manager

8 at risk or design builder shall award to Wyoming resident

9 contractors not less than seventy percent (70%) of the

10 value of the total subcontract work to be performed for the

11 project;

12

13 (C) The requirement of subparagraph (B) of

14 this paragraph may be waived upon a written determination

15 that:

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17 (I) The work to be performed is

18 specialized or of such a scale that it can be more suitably

19 performed by out-of-state contractors;

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21 (II) The bid amounts submitted by

22 Wyoming subcontractors exceed one hundred five percent

23 (105%) of the costs of out-of-state providers for

24 equivalent quality of work or services; or

1 2 (III) The enforcement of the delay completion 3 requirement would unreasonably of 4 construction. 5 Any waiver shall be approved in writing 6 by the following persons: 7 8 9 (I) For projects to be completed by 10 the state of Wyoming, by the director of the department of administration and information; 11 12 13 (II)For projects to be completed by the University of Wyoming, by the president of the

14 university and the president of the board of trustees; 15

17 (III) For projects subject to review by the school facilities commission, by the director of the 18 school facilities commission and the chairman of the board 19 20 of the school facilities commission; and

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22 (IV) For projects completed by community college, by the community college president and 23 its chairman of the board of trustees. 24

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2 (E) Any approved waiver shall be documented

3 in writing and provided to the governor and chairs of the

4 joint appropriations interim committee.

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6 (ii) This paragraph shall apply to all

7 construction delivery methods:

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9 (A) The procurement of furniture, fixtures

10 and equipment shall be done by competitive bid based upon

11 either:

12

13 (I) Generic specifications; or

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15 (II) Specifications addressing

16 performance standards and functional requirements

17 determined by the agency, but without specification of

18 individual brands or manufacturers.

20 (B) No person who was employed by the

21 agency to prepare the bid documents, whether with or

22 without compensation, shall be eligible to bid on the final

23 bid package;

1 (C) A five percent (5%) preference shall be

2 granted to Wyoming resident suppliers for procurements

3 subject to this paragraph.

4

5 (iii) All bids shall be open in public in an

6 office of the agency soliciting the bid;

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8 (iv) Contractor progress payments shall be made

9 only after the agency has been supplied with applicable

10 lien waivers signed by the materialman, subcontractor or

11 laborer, as applicable, or upon the contractor's affidavit

12 that all materialmen, subcontractors and laborers have been

13 paid for that portion of payment requested, less any

14 contracted amounts held for retainage or which the

15 contractor has a reasonable basis for dispute.

16

17 (b) No funds subject to this section shall be

18 expended unless the contracting agency has submitted a plan

19 to the governor and cochairman of the joint appropriations

20 interim committee which promotes the employment of Wyoming

21 resident architects in the planning and design phases of

22 facilities funded with monies subject to this section. The

23 plans shall allow for partnerships between Wyoming

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1 architectural firms and nonresident firms when necessary to

2 secure specialized services required for a project.

3

Any agency which has received an appropriation of 4 5 state funds on or after July 1, 2008, for any capital construction project shall conduct a review of each project 6 funded with state funds to assess whether contractors that 7 were awarded contracts using a resident preference complied 8 9 in all respects to applicable resident preference laws. If 10 the agency determines that there is reasonable suspicion 11 that a contractor failed to comply with the resident preference laws, the agency shall report the matter to the 12 13 attorney general. The attorney general shall take such enforcement action on behalf of the state of Wyoming and 14 15 the agency against the contractor as he deems appropriate.

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(d) The governor may modify any requirement of this section by executive order if he determines it to be necessary to promote effective competitive bidding. Any order shall be effective only until June 30, 2012 or until superseded by law.

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23 (e) This section is repealed effective June 30, 2012.

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1 Section 2. The joint appropriations interim committee

2 shall study the impacts of the statutory changes under this

3 act and shall propose permanent changes to contractor

4 preference laws consistent with this act. The committee

5 shall further propose changes to the resident preference

6 laws as it determines necessary to effectively enforce

7 those laws and to deter violations of those provisions.

8 The committee shall present its recommendations for

9 consideration in the 2012 budget session.

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11 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

14 Constitution.
