SIXTY-FOURTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING  
2017 GENERAL SESSION

AN ACT relating to the judicial branch; increasing salaries of circuit court judges; providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

*Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

**Section 1.** W.S. 5-1-110(a)(iii) is amended to read:

**5-1-110. Salaries of judges.**

(a) Subject to constitutional and statutory provisions concerning when salaries can become effective, judges of the supreme court, district courts and circuit courts shall receive the following annual salaries which shall be paid in equal monthly installments on the last working day of the month:

(iii) Circuit court judges shall receive an annual salary of ~~one hundred two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$102,800.00) commencing July 1, 2009 and~~ one hundred nineteen thousand dollars (\$119,000.00) commencing July 1, 2012 and one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000.00) commencing July 1, 2017.

**Section 2.** There is appropriated one hundred eighty-eight thousand dollars (\$188,000.00) from the general fund to the supreme court. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2018. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of implementing the judicial salary increase authorized by this act. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this
