General government appropriations.

Sponsored by: Joint Appropriations Committee

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to supplemental appropriations for the
2 operation of state government; increasing or decreasing
3 certain amounts; adjusting the number of positions; modifying
4 prior appropriations; making additional appropriations; making
5 certain appropriations subject to the terms and conditions
6 specified; providing transfers of certain funds as specified;
7 and providing for effective dates.

9 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

10

11 **Section 1.** As used in this act:

14 government receiving an appropriation under this act;

1 (b) "Appropriation" means the authorizations granted by
2 the legislature under this act to make expenditures from and
3 to incur obligations against the general and other funds as
4 specified;

6 (c) "Approved budget" means an approved budget as
7 defined by W.S. 9-2-1005(e);

9 (d) "A4" means agency trust account;

11 (e) "EF" means the agency's account within the
12 enterprise fund;

13

14 (f) "FF" means federal funds;

15

16 (g) "IS" means the agency's account within the internal
17 service fund;

18

19 (h) "PF" means the retirement account created by W.S.
20 9-3-407(a);

21

22 (j) "PR" means private funding sources;

23

1 (k) "P2" means the deferred compensation account
2 referenced in W.S. 9-3-507;

 7 dollars (\$190,000.00) shall only be effective for the period beginning
 8 July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017. The tribal liaisons and governor's
 9 office shall report to the joint appropriations committee not later than
 10 November 1, 2016 outlining how the deliverables established in 2014
 11 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 26, Section 2, Section 001, footnote 3 have
 12 been and will be achieved, as well as any recommendation for revisions,
 13 including the level of future appropriations. The appropriation associated
 14 with this footnote shall not be included in the agency's 2019-2020
 15 standard budget request.

16

17 2. This general fund appropriation shall be deposited into the federal
 18 natural resource policy account created by W.S. 9-4-218(a).

19

20 3. Of this general fund appropriation, eighty thousand dollars
 21 (\$80,000.00) shall be effective for the period beginning July 1, 2017 and
 22 ending June 30, 2018. The tribal liaisons and governor's office shall
 23 report to the joint appropriations committee and the select committee on
 24 tribal relations not later than November 1, 2017 outlining how the funds
 25 subject to this footnote are being and will be expended to achieve the

3 (\$3,000,000.00)SR for purposes of compensation and benefits for up to nine
4 (9) full-time employees, support costs and professional contracts for
5 internal investment management. Savings shall be reported by the state
6 treasurer to the joint appropriations committee and the select committee
7 on capital financing and investments not later than December 1, 2017 and
8 June 30, 2018, respectively. Reported savings shall be limited to
9 foregone expenditures from terminated or renegotiated contracts with
10 external investment managers and funds for which the appropriation in this
11 section have not and shall not be expended for external investment manager
12 contracts. To the extent expenditures are recurring, authorization for
13 positions and required appropriations shall be included in the state
14 treasurer's 2019-2020 biennial budget request.

1 1. In the event that federal funding becomes unavailable to maintain one
 2 hundred percent (100%) reimbursement for an authorized position budgeted
 3 with one hundred percent (100%) federal funds in this section, as
 4 determined by the United States property and fiscal officer for Wyoming,
 5 the adjutant general shall eliminate the position.

6

7 2. To the extent not prohibited by federal law, five (5) federally funded
 8 firefighting positions authorized in this section shall be available for
 9 firefighting outside of the boundaries of Camp Guernsey.

10

11 3. Of this general fund appropriation, two hundred thousand dollars
 12 (\$200,000.00) for veterans' commission service organization contracts
 13 shall not be included in the agency's 2019-2020 standard budget request.

14

15 4. The department shall accommodate any reduction in services to the
 16 national guard youth challenge program resulting from a decrease in
 17 appropriations under this act so as to avoid any disruption of services to
 18 youth currently enrolled in the program as of the effective date of this
 19 act.

20

21 5. Of this general fund appropriation, twenty thousand dollars
 22 (\$20,000.00) shall only be expended to match funds from other private
 23 sources for purposes of moving costs and acquiring storage space for
 24 veterans' museum artifacts and related items. Notwithstanding any other
 25 provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended
