Education reporting-children of military personnel.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to education accountability; providing for
2 performance reporting for students with a parent or
3 guardian who is a military member; and providing for an
4 effective date.

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6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-204(j) (ii) is amended to read:

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10 **21-2-204. Wyoming Accountability in Education Act;**
11 **statewide education accountability system created.**

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13 (j) Measured performance results obtained and
14 collected pursuant to this section, together with
15 subsequent actions responding to results, shall be combined
16 with other information and measures maintained and acquired

1 under W.S. 21-2-202(a)(xxi), 21-2-304(a)(v)(H),
2 21-3-110(a)(xxiv) and otherwise by law, to be used as the
3 basis of a statewide system for providing periodic and
4 uniform reporting on the progress of state public education
5 achievement compared to established targets. The statewide
6 accountability system shall include a process for
7 consolidating, coordinating and analyzing existing
8 performance data and reports for purposes of aligning with
9 the requirements of this section and for determinations of
10 student achievement incorporated into the statewide system.
11 In establishing a reporting system under this subsection,
12 the department shall describe the performance of each
13 public school in Wyoming. The performance report shall:

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15 (ii) In a manner to maintain student
16 confidentiality, be disaggregated as appropriate by content
17 level, target level, grade level and appropriate subgroups
18 of students. For purposes of this paragraph, reported
19 subgroups of students shall include at minimum,
20 economically disadvantaged students, English language
21 learners, identified racial and ethnic groups, students
22 with a parent or guardian who is a member of the armed
23 forces of the United States whether full-time or part-time,

1 students with disabilities and full-time virtual education
2 students;

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4 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2018.
