shall report to the governor and the joint education interim 1 2 committee of the legislature on recommendations for 3 modifications to the success curriculum requirements, minimum 4 cumulative GPA and minimum national percentile rank scores or WORKKEYS <u>career-technical</u> <u>aptitude</u> minimum cumulative 5 contained in 6 assessment scores this article and recommendations for the adoption of statewide student 7 8 assessment standards and scores to augment qualifying national percentile rankings or WORKKEYS—career-technical 9 10 aptitude assessment scores, all to ensure that the Hathaway 11 scholarship program is designed to provide the desired 12 incentives for students to pursue a rigorous curriculum and 13 strive to achieve academic success. The report shall also include any additional resources which school districts, 14 particularly those school districts granted exemptions for 15 16 students under paragraph (f)(ii) of this section, may require 17 to provide the success curriculum. The cumulative GPA requirements for performance under the success curriculum 18 19 shall not be restricted to those courses comprising the 20 success curriculum, but shall be applied comprehensively to 21 all courses included within each scholarship student's high school curriculum. 22

In developing the annual reporting procedure the 4 department shall consult with the University of Wyoming and community college financial aid officers and registrars or 5 their designees. It is the intention of the legislature that 6 the reporting system and the requirements thereof shall be 7 8 applicable to all recipients of scholarships under this 9 Compliance with this section shall be made a article. 10 condition of receiving a scholarship under this article. For 11 any student attending more than one (1) eligible institution, 12 the home institution shall be responsible for data reporting 13 for that student, and any other eligible institution shall cooperate as necessary with the home institution to fulfill 14 15 that duty. The reporting system shall include the following 16 information:

18 Scholarships by students as they progress 19 from semester to semester or other equivalent periods of time 20 as may be applicable once enrolled at an eligible institution. 21 The data shall be reported by institution attended, by the instructional program, and by scholarship category and shall 22 23 include the percent of students losing scholarship

1 eligibility due to not earning the minimum number of credit 2 hours, the percent of students losing scholarship eligibility 3 due to not having the required cumulative grade point average, 4 the percent of students losing scholarship eligibility for 5 failing to make satisfactory academic progress and the percentage of students losing scholarship eligibility for 6 failing to enroll. The same information shall also be reported 7 8 by categories showing those students qualifying through WORKKEYS career-technical aptitude assessment scores and 9 10 scores on high school equivalency certification, and by the group of students who attended a home-based educational 11 program and did not graduate from an eligible high school; 12 13 14 (vii) Statistical studies on the relationship between the courses taken and grades earned by a high school 15 16 student and the student's score associated with the 2015-2016 national percentile rankings, on an examination administered 17 18 throughout the United States and relied upon by institutions 19 of higher education to determine acceptance of students for 20 attendance or score on the WORKKEYS test career-technical 21 aptitude assessment. Relative to public high schools, such statistical studies shall use student course and grade data 22

that is otherwise available from the schools and such studies

1 shall be conducted at no additional cost to the governing 2 authority of any public high school; 3 4 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-16-1307(b)(v) and (vi) is repealed. 5 Section 3. 6 7 8 The success curriculum required to qualify for (a) 9 honor or performance scholarship eligibility under W.S. 10 21-16-1301 et seq. for students graduating from high school 11 in the 2018-2019 or 2019-2020 school years may be either the 12 success curriculum as provided in W.S. 21-16-1307(b) before 13 its amendment by this act or the success curriculum as 14 provided in W.S. 21-16-1307(b) as amended by this act. 15 16 (b) This act shall not affect the success curriculum required to qualify for honor or performance scholarship 17 eligibility under W.S. 21-16-1301 et seq. for students 18 19 graduating high school before the 2018-2019 school year. 20 (c) The success curriculum required to qualify for 21 22 honor or performance scholarship eligibility under W.S.
