Source of revenue increase:

The increased revenue will be from the change of the court automation fee to \$40.00 assessed on most court cases. The fee was previously \$25.00 for the supreme court, circuit court, municipal court and chancery court; the fee was previously \$30 for the district court. The supreme court filing fee is increased from \$25.00 to \$75.00. Docketing and transcript fees are increased from \$85.00 to \$100.00.

Source of expenditure increase:

Additional revenue collected will be used for critical court technology projects statewide. In particular, funds will be used to implement cloud infrastructure, cyber security, software maintenance and required updates.

## Assumptions:

In this projection, court filings throughout the state are assumed to remain relatively consistent from year-to-year.

Any additional fiscal or personnel impact is not determinable due to insufficient time to complete the fiscal note process.
