## FISCAL NOTE

No significant fiscal or personnel impact.

While a recent Wyoming Attorney General's opinion interpreted current Wyoming statute to allow cities, towns, and counties as political subdivisions to be eligible to join the State group insurance plan, Employees' Group Insurance (EGI) has not requested or received any spending authority budget changes for the 2021-22 biennium budget. Cities, towns and counties that participate in the EGI plan would be required to pay the same premiums as other entities currently covered by the EGI plan to cover their administrative and claims costs. While one political subdivision has elected to enroll on January 1, 2020, no premiums have been collected and no claims have been paid as of December 2019. This bill would keep EGI's spending authority at current levels, prior to the addition of political subdivisions.
