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8	Section 1. W.S. 1-39-110(b) and 1-39-118(a)(i) and
9	(ii) are amended to read:
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11	1-39-110. Liability; health care providers.
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13	(b) Notwithstanding W.S. 1-39-118(a), for claims
14	under this section against a physician, physician
15	assistant, nurse, optometrist or dentist who is employed by

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a governmental entity or who is deemed to be a public 1 2 employee of the state by virtue of a contract pursuant to 3 W.S. 35-31-101 through 35-31-103, based upon an act, error 4 or omission occurring on or after May 1, 1988, the liability of a governmental entity shall not exceed the sum 5 of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant for 6 any number of claims arising out of a single transaction or 7 8 occurrence. nor exceed the sum of one million dollars 9 (\$1,000,000.00) for all claims of all claimants arising out 10 of a single transaction or occurrence.

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1-39-118. Maximum liability; insurance authorized.

14 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this 15 section, in any action under this act, the liability of the 16 governmental entity, including a public employee while 17 acting within the scope of his duties, shall not exceed:

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19 (i) The sum of two hundred fifty thousand 20 dollars (\$250,000.00) five hundred thousand dollars 21 (\$500,000.00) to any claimant for any number of claims 22 arising out of a single transaction or occurrence; or 23

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1	(ii) The sum of five hundred thousand dollars
2	(\$500,000.00) <u>one million five hundred</u> thousand dollars
3	(\$1,500,000.00) for all claims of all claimants arising out
4	of a single transaction or occurrence.
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6	Section 2. This act shall only apply to claims
7	arising out of transactions or occurrences taking place on
8	or after July 1, 2020.

10	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2020.
