1 AN ACT relating to emergency budgeting for the expenses of

government; temporarily amending the computation of school 2

district operating balances and cash reserves; providing for 3

4 carryover and reappropriaton of certain funds as specified;

5 authorizing the transfer of appropriations; and providing for

6 an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-13-313(e) is amended to read:

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12 21-13-313. Distribution of funds from foundation

13 account; property tax and cash reserve adjustment;

1 (e) Except as provided under this subsection, not later 2 than January 31 of each fiscal year, the department shall 3 compute the amount by which each district's operating balance 4 and cash reserves at the end of the preceding fiscal year exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the total foundation program 5 6 amount computed under W.S. 21-13-309 for the preceding fiscal year. For fiscal year 2020-2021, the department shall compute 7 8 the amount by which each district's operating balance and 9 cash reserves at the end of the preceding fiscal year exceed 10 twenty-five percent (25%) of the total foundation program amount computed under W.S. 21-13-309 for the preceding fiscal 11 12 year. In making this calculation, the entire operating 13 balance and cash reserves for each district for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, as computed by the department, 14 shall be separately accounted for and excluded, until it has 15 16 been completely expended by the district. Revenues from settlements of protested amounts attributable to levies 17 18 assessed under W.S. 21-13-102(a)(i)(A) and (ii)(A) and 19 21-13-201, regardless of the assessment year, shall be 20 accounted for and excluded from the calculation under this 21 subsection for a period of not more than one (1) year 22 following that fiscal year in which the revenue was received 23 by a district, as verified in writing by the district and

1 certified by the county treasurer. Except as otherwise 2 provided in 1997 Special Session Laws, chapter 3, section 3 306(e), as amended, and except as excluded under this 4 subsection, that excess shall be deemed to be a state revenue 5 under W.S. 21-13-310(a) for the purpose of determining distributions under W.S. 21-13-311 and amounts to be rebated 6 7 under W.S. 21-13-102. The department shall promulgate rules, 8 including reporting requirements and procedures for 9 districts, to implement this subsection. As used in this 10 section, "operating balance and cash reserves" means those financial resources of the district which are not encumbered 11 12 by the district board of trustees for expenditure to meet an existing legal obligation or otherwise restricted by law or 13 regulation for expenditure on 14 specific educational 15 programs. For purposes of this subsection, any balance 16 within a district's separate account established under W.S. 17 21-15-109(e) for major building and facility repair and replacement shall be deemed restricted by law for expenditure 18 as provided by W.S. 21-15-109(e) and shall not be considered 19 20 an operating balance and cash reserve under this section.
