 "(a) During a public health emergency as defined by W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i), any health care provider or other person, including a business entity, who in good faith follows the instructions of a state, city, town or county health officer or who acts in good faith in responding to the public health emergency is immune from any liability arising from complying with those instructions or acting in good faith. This immunity shall apply to health care providers who are retired, who have an inactive license or who are licensed in another state without a valid Wyoming license and while performing as a volunteer during a declared public health emergency as defined by W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i). This immunity shall not apply to acts or omissions constituting gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct.

(d) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, during a public health emergency as defined by W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i), any person or other entity shall be immune from civil liability for any acts or omissions of the person or entity that caused another to be exposed to or to contract the disease, agent or toxin for which the public health emergency is declared. This immunity shall not apply to acts or omissions constituting gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct. For purposes of this subsection, any complaint alleging that acts or omissions of a person or entity caused another to be exposed to or to contract the disease, agent or toxin for which a public health emergency is declared shall state with particularity the acts or omissions constituting the basis of the civil action, which shall be proven by clear and convincing evidence.

(e) The immunity provided in subsection (d) of this section shall only apply to:

 (i) Claims alleging that actions or omissions caused exposure to or the contraction of a disease, agent or toxin for which a public health emergency was declared under W.S. 35-4-

115(a)(i) and arising from actions or omissions occurring during the declared public health emergency; and

(ii) Any person or entity whose alleged act or omission was in substantial compliance or was consistent with any federal, state, county or municipal statute, regulation, order, ordinance or public health guidance related to the disease, agent or toxin for which a public health emergency is declared under W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i).".
