1 AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; authorizing the 2 licensing and registration of specified off-road vehicles; 3 amending vehicle equipment requirements as specified; amending limitations on the use of specified off-road 4 5 recreational vehicles on public roadways; making conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date. 6 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 Section 1. W.S. 31-2-232 is created to read: 10 11 12 31-2-232. Specified off-road vehicle licensing and 13 registration. 14

1 (a) Off-road recreational vehicles as defined by W.S. 2 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) may be registered and licensed 3 pursuant to this section. 4 (b) Before the owner of an off-road recreational 5 vehicle as defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) may 6 operate the vehicle upon any public road, except pursuant 7 8 to W.S. 31-5-1601(a) through (c), the owner shall register the vehicle by submitting an application to the county 9 10 treasurer indicating: 11 12 (i) The owner wishes to operate the vehicle upon public roadways in Wyoming; 13 14 (ii) The vehicle is owned and operated primarily 15 16 for the purposes of off-road recreational use or other 17 related activities and will not be used primarily for general transportation upon public roadways; 18 19 20 (iii) The vehicle is titled in Wyoming; 21 22 (iv) The applicant has certified on a form created by the department 23 that the vehicle has the 2 HB0086

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1 equipment required by W.S. 31-5-912(b), 31-5-913(a) and 2 (b), 31-5-914, 31-5-915(a), 31-5-917, 31-5-952, 31-5-953, 3 31-5-954(a), 31-5-956 and 31-5-1601(a)(iv) and (v)(B). 4 5 (c) Upon receipt of an approved application and payment of fees the county treasurer shall issue to the 6 applicant a certificate of registration together with one 7 8 (1) license plate or validation sticker. The registration fee for off-road recreational vehicles shall be the same 9 rate as for motorcycles. The registration expires upon 10 11 transfer of ownership of the vehicle. License plates on the 12 off-road recreational vehicle shall be displayed in accordance with W.S. 31-2-205. 13 14 15 Section **2**. W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II), 31-2-205(a)(i)(A) by creating a new subdivision (IX), 16

Definitions. 2 3 (a) Except as otherwise provided, as used in this 4 act: 5 (xv) "Motor vehicle" means every vehicle which б 7 is self-propelled except vehicles moved solely by human 8 power, electric bicycles or motorized skateboards. The term includes the following vehicles as hereafter defined: 9 10 (K) "Off-road recreational vehicle" means: 11 12 13 (II) Any unlicensed motorcycle which not required by law to be licensed that has an unladen 14 weight of six hundred (600) pounds or less, and is designed 15 16 to be ridden off-road with the operator astride upon a seat 17 or saddle and travels on two (2) tires; and 18 19 31-2-205. 1 (i) Conspicuously displayed and securely 2 fastened to be plainly visible: 3 4 (A) One (1) on the front of the vehicle, excluding the following: 5 6 7 (IX) Off-road recreational vehicles as 8 defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are registered 9 pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232. 10 11 31-2-224. Registration exemptions. 12 13 (b) Off-road recreational vehicles shall are not required to be registered. Off-road recreational vehicles 14 as defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) shall be 15 registered as provided by W.S. 31-2-232 if they are to be 16 17 operated on public roadways. 18 19 31-5-124. Off-road recreational vehicles; 20 multipurpose vehicles; limitation on use; equipment. 21

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1 (a) No person shall operate an off-road recreational 2 vehicle as defined in W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K) upon public 3 streets or highways except: 4 (ii) For operation of a vehicle in accordance 5 with the provisions of W.S. 31-5-1601;-6 7 (iii) For off-road recreational vehicles as 8 defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are registered 9 10 pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232.11 12 (c) Off-road recreational vehicles shall not be 13 operated on interstate highways. 14 31-5-901. General requirements; applicability of 15 16 provisions. 17 (c) The provisions of W.S. 31-5-901 through 31-5-970 18 19 and regulations of the superintendent with respect to 20 equipment required on vehicles shall not apply to vehicles 21 moved solely by human power, motorcycles, autocycles, motor-driven cycles, mopeds, electric 22 bicycles, multipurpose vehicles, off-road recreational vehicles as 23

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defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II), implements of 1 husbandry, highway construction machinery or farm tractors 2 3 except as specifically made applicable. 4 5 31-5-912. Head lamps. б 7 (b) A motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, multipurpose 8 vehicle which is fifty (50) inches or less in width, or moped or off-road recreational vehicle as defined by W.S. 9 10 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that is registered pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232 shall be equipped with at least one (1) head lamp 11 12 which shall comply with the regulations of the superintendent. 13 14 31-5-913. Tail lamps. 15 16 17 (a) A motor vehicle, multipurpose vehicle which is than fifty (50) inches in width, trailer, 18 greater 19 semitrailer, pole trailer or any other vehicle which is 20 being drawn at the end of a combination of vehicles, shall 21 be equipped with at least two (2) tail lamps mounted on the rear, which shall comply with the regulations of the 22 23 superintendent. The superintendent may by regulation allow

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1	one (1) tail lamp on any vehicle equipped with only one (1)
2	when it was made. A motorcycle, motor-driven cycle,
3	multipurpose vehicle which is fifty (50) inches or less in
4	width, autocycle, or moped or off-road recreational vehicle
5	as defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that is
б	registered pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232 shall be equipped with
7	at least one (1) tail lamp which shall comply with the
8	regulations of the superintendent.
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10	31-5-914. Rear reflectors.
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12	Every motor vehicle, multipurpose vehicle which is greater
13	than fifty (50) inches in width, trailer, semitrailer, pole
14	trailer or other vehicle which is being drawn at the end of
15	a combination of vehicles shall carry on the rear, either
16	as a part of the tail lamps or separately, two (2) or more
17	red reflectors complying with the regulations of the
18	superintendent. Motorcycles, motor-driven cycles,
19	multipurpose vehicles which are fifty (50) inches or less
20	in width, autocycles, or mopeds or off-road recreational
21	vehicles as defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are
22	registered pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232 shall carry on the

1 rear at least one (1) red reflector complying with the 2 regulations of the superintendent. 3 4 31-5-915. Stop lamps; electric turn signal lamps. 5 (a) Every motor vehicle, multipurpose vehicle which 6 is greater than fifty (50) inches in width, trailer, 7 8 semitrailer, pole trailer or other vehicle which is being drawn at the end of a combination of vehicles shall be 9 10 equipped with two (2) or more stop lamps complying with the 11 regulations of the superintendent. Every motorcycle, 12 motor-driven cycle, multipurpose vehicle which is fifty 13 (50) inches or less in width, autocycle, or moped or off-road recreational vehicle as defined by W.S. 14 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that is registered pursuant to W.S. 15 16 31-2-232 shall be equipped with at least one (1) stop lamp 17 complying with the regulations of the superintendent. The superintendent may by regulation allow one (1) stop lamp on 18 19 any vehicle equipped with only one (1) when it was made. 20 21 31-5-952. Horns and warning devices.

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17	(a) On or before January 1, 1986, every motor vehicle
18	including motorcycles, motor-driven cycles, multipurpose
19	vehicles, and mopeds and off-road recreational vehicles as
20	defined by W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are registered
21	pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232 shall be equipped with a mirror
22	mounted on the left side of the vehicle and so located as

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to reflect to the driver a view of the highway to the rear 1 2 of the vehicle. 3 4 31-5-956. Tires; restriction of travel under 5 hazardous conditions; penalties. 6 7 (h) This section applies to motorcycles, motor-driven 8 cycles, multipurpose vehicles, and mopeds and off-road recreational vehicles as defined by W.S. 9 10 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are registered pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232. 11 12 31-5-1601. Operation on highways. 13 14 (d) Off-road recreational vehicles as defined by W.S. 15 16 31-1-101(a)(xv)(K)(II) that are registered pursuant to W.S. 31-2-232 may be operated upon any open public road 17 rights-of-way, streets, roads or highways within Wyoming, 18 19 notwithstanding the designation of the public road 20 right-of-way, street, road or highway as a Wyoming off-road recreational vehicle trail pursuant to W.S. 21 31-2-701 through 31-2-707. 22

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1 (e) Off-road recreational vehicles shall not be operated on interstate highways. 2 3 4 Section 3. The department of transportation shall create or utilize an existing certification form to provide 5 6 to applicants in order to certify the equipment requirements imposed by this act. 7 8 Section 4.
