The endowment fund shall consist of those 7 8 monies designated to the fund by law. Monies deposited to the endowment fund inviolate and constitute a 9 are 10 perpetual fund which shall be invested by the state treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-715(a), (d) and (e) 11 and in a manner to obtain the highest return possible 12 consistent with preservation of the endowment fund corpus. 13 14 (b) The state treasurer shall credit annually to a 15 Wyoming front line health care education endowment fund 16
