9 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-16-1701 is created to read:

14 21-16-1701. Presumption relating to previously taken

15 courses; hearing.

2 Any university or college receiving funding from the state 3 of Wyoming shall presume in perpetuity that any college 4 level credit hour previously completed with an acceptable 5 grade in a Wyoming university or college shall remain valid and transferrable to any degree program. The university or 6 college may, on a case-by-case basis, decline to accept the 7 8 presumed credit hour when the previously completed course 9 does not provide the necessary knowledge and skills for the 10 course as administered when the student seeks to apply the 11 credit. The university or college shall reduce to writing 12 and provide to the student the reasons the student's course 13 credit is not accepted. The student may challenge the decision not to accept the credit at a hearing before the 14 board of trustees, or its designee, which designee shall 15 16 not be the same person or governing body that made the 17 initial decision. The student shall have the burden to show 18 the previously completed course provides the necessary 19 knowledge and skills for the course for which the student 20 seeks to apply the credit. If the student 21 sufficient showing, the completed course shall satisfy the program requirement for which the student seeks to apply 22 the credit. The Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act shall 23

1 not apply to the hearing. The board of trustees of the

2 university and each college shall establish and implement a

3 policy and process in accordance with this section.
