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- 8 **Section 1.** The following proposal to amend Wyoming
- 9 Constitution, Article 1, Section 38 by creating a new
- 10 subsection (e) is proposed for submission to the electors of
- 11 the State of Wyoming at the next general election for approval
- 12 or rejection to become valid as a part of the Constitution if
- 13 ratified by a majority of the electors at the election:

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15 Article 1, Section 38. Right of health care access.

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2 (e) Consistent with applicable federal law in place on 3 the first day of January, 2021, the state shall provide 4 Medicaid benefits to low income residents of the state whose 5 income is at or below one hundred thirty-eight percent (138%) of the federal poverty level. The legislature may by general 6 law restrict the state from providing Medicaid benefits that 7 8 exceed those that were in place on the date prescribed in 9 this subsection should applicable federal law change after 10 that date in a manner that expands eligibility for Medicaid benefits or otherwise increases the financial obligation of 11 12 the state under the Medicaid program.

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14 Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse 15 the following statement on the proposed amendment:

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17 This amendment to the Wyoming Constitution would require the state to take steps necessary to provide Medicaid benefits to 18 19 low income residents whose income is at or below one 20 hundred thirty-eight percent (138%) of the federal poverty 21 level and who meet other nonfinancial eligibility 22 requirements for Medicaid participation. The state would not 23 be required to provide Medicaid benefits or expend additional
