A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming

2 Constitution to impose term limits on the state offices of

3 senator, representative, governor, secretary of state,

4 treasurer, auditor and superintendent of public instruction.

- 6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING,
- 7 two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting
- 8 separately, concurring therein:

- 10 **Section 1.** The following proposal to amend the Wyoming
- 11 Constitution, Article 3, Section 2 and Article 4, Sections 2
- 12 and 11 is proposed for submission to the electors of the State
- 13 of Wyoming at the next general election for approval or
- 14 rejection to become valid as a part of the Constitution if

15 ratified by a majority of the electors at the election:

1 Article 3, Section 2. Members' terms and 2 qualifications.

3

4 (a) Senators shall be elected for the term of four (4) years and representatives for the term of two (2) years. The 5 senators elected at the first election shall be divided by 6 lot into two classes as nearly equal as may be. The seats of 7 8 senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the first two years, and of the second class at the 9 10 expiration of four years. No person shall be a senator who 11 has not attained the age of twenty-five years, or a 12 representative who has not attained the age of twenty-one years, and who is not a citizen of the United States and of 13 this state and who has not, for at least twelve months next 14 preceding his election resided within the county or district 15 16 in which he was elected.

(b) No person shall be eligible to stand for election or appointment as a senator if the person by the end of the current term of office for which the person was elected or appointed will have served, or but for resignation or removal would have served, a total of twelve (12) or more years in the Wyoming senate. No person shall be eligible to stand for

10 No person shall be eligible to the office of governor unless

11 he be the person is a citizen of the United States and a

12 qualified elector of the state, who has attained the age of

13 thirty years, and who has resided 5 years next preceding the

14 election within the state or territory, nor shall he the

15 person be eligible to any other office during the term for

16 which he the person was elected. No person shall be eligible

17 to stand for election or appointment as governor if the person

18 by the end of the current term of office as governor will

19 <u>have served</u>, or but for resignation or removal would have

20 <u>served</u>, a total of eight (8) or more years as governor.

2 There shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the state 3 at the times and places of choosing members of the

4 legislature, a secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, and

5 superintendent of public instruction, who shall have attained

6 the age of twenty-five (25) years respectively, shall be

7 citizens of the United States, and shall have the

8 qualifications of state electors. They shall severally hold

9 their offices at the seat of government, for the term of four

10 (4) years and until their successors are elected and duly

11 qualified. The legislature may provide for such other state

12 officers as are deemed necessary. No person shall be eligible

13 to stand for election or appointment as the secretary of

14 state, auditor, treasurer, or superintendent of public

instruction if the person by the end of the current term of

16 office for which the person was elected or appointed will

17 <u>have served</u>, or but for resignation or removal would have

18 served, a total of eight (8) or more years in the same elected

19 <u>office.</u>

20

21 **Section 2.** That the Secretary of State shall endorse 22 the following statement on the proposed amendment:

23

1 The adoption of this amendment will impose term limits 2 for state senators and state representatives, the governor, 3 secretary of state, auditor, treasurer and superintendent of 4 public instruction. If a person will have served, or but for 5 resignation or removal would have served, a total of twelve (12) or more years in the Wyoming senate, a total of ten (10) 6 7 or more years in the Wyoming house of representatives or a 8 total of eight (8) or more years in the same statewide elected office, the person would not be eligible to be elected or 9 10 appointed again to that office.
