12 "(b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section,
13 a person who intentionally violates this section commits a
14 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6)
15 months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars
16 (\$750.00), or both.

18 (c) Notwithstanding the penalty imposed under subsection (b)
19 of this section, any person who intentionally violates this section
20 on account of a person's COVID-19 vaccination status commits a
21 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than fifty dollars
22 (\$50.00) subject to the following conditions:
23

24 (i) Notwithstanding the authority granted under W.S. 7-
25 2-102(b)(i), a peace officer shall not arrest a person without a
26 warrant for an alleged violation of this section and may only issue
27 a citation as a charging document; and
28

29 (ii) No conviction under this subsection, whether by
30 guilty plea, adjudication of guilt or forfeiture of bond shall be
31 reported by the court to any law enforcement agency. Upon payment
32 of the fine imposed by this section, a criminal conviction under
33 this section shall be expunged by operation of law from all records
34 of the court six (6) months after the entry of conviction. For any
35 person whose record of conviction is expunged under this
36 subsection, the conviction is deemed not to have occurred and the
37 individual may reply accordingly upon any inquiry in the matter.
38 No expungement under this subsection shall be considered for
39 purposes of any other law providing for expungement.

41 (d) As used in this section:

43 (i) "COVID-19" means as defined by W.S. 1-1-141(a)(ii);

1 (ii) "COVID-19 vaccination" means any vaccine that is
2 marketed to prevent COVID-19 or any vaccine that is marketed to
3 diminish or decrease the symptoms of COVID-19;
4

5 (iii) "COVID-19 vaccination status" means evidence of
6 whether a person has received one (1) or more doses of a COVID-19
