8 (a) As directed by the governor, the insurance commissioner 9 of this state and the director of the department of health shall as soon as practicable negotiate with the centers for Medicare and 10 11 Medicaid services of the United States department of health and 12 human services to obtain a state plan amendment or other federal 13 authorization to provide for Medicaid expansion to cover all 14 persons described under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1396a(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII), or any 15 16 other federal law that replaces that act before the repeal of this 17 section and subject to the requirements imposed under subsection 18 (b) of this section.

20 (b) If the negotiation required by subsection (a) of this 21 section reveals viable and fiscally advantageous options as 22 determined by the governor for the expansion of Medicaid 23 eligibility in Wyoming, the governor by and through the department 24 of health is authorized to pursue any Medicaid plan amendments or 25 other waivers that are necessary and prudent for the expansion. Any expansion authorized under this section shall be subject to 26 27 the following requirements and restrictions:

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(i) Any expansion of Medicaid under this section shall not be administered during any time period in which the increased federal medical assistance percentage, as currently provided under 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(y), is less than ninety percent (90%), nor shall any expansion of Medicaid under this section be administered during any time period in which the regular federal medical assistance percentage for Wyoming under 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(b) is less than the
