6 "(b) Instruction on the topics enumerated in this section and  
7 any supporting materials shall be consistent with the following  
8 principles of individual freedom:  
9

10 (i) No person is inherently racist, sexist or  
11 oppressive, whether consciously or unconsciously, solely by virtue  
12 of his race or sex;  
13

14 (ii) No race is inherently superior to another race;  
15

16 (iii) No person shall be discriminated against or  
17 receive adverse treatment solely or partly on the basis of race,  
18 color, national origin, religion, disability or sex;  
19

20 (iv) Meritocracy or traits, including a hard work ethic,  
21 are not racist but are fundamental to the right to pursue happiness  
22 and to be rewarded for industriousness;  
23

24 (v) No person, by virtue of his race or sex, bears  
25 responsibility for actions committed in the past by other members  
26 of the same race or sex;  
27

28 (vi) No person shall be made to feel discomfort, guilt,  
29 anguish or any other form of psychological distress on account of  
30 his race;

32 (vii) Instructional personnel may facilitate discussions  
33 and use curricula to address, in an age-appropriate manner, the  
34 topics of sexism, slavery, racial oppression, racial segregation  
35 and racial discrimination, including topics relating to the  
36 enactment and enforcement of laws resulting in sexism, racial  
37 oppression, racial segregation and racial discrimination.  
38 Classroom instruction and curricula shall not be used to  
39 indoctrinate or persuade students to a particular point of view  
40 inconsistent with the principles of this subsection or state
