This bill amends the offenses that would disqualify a person for life from driving a commercial vehicle in Wyoming. This bill adds human trafficking to the list of offenses that would disqualify a person from holding a Wyoming Commercial Driver's License.

Passage of this bill will allow the Department of Transportation to avoid the assessment of penalties by the Federal Highway Administration (FHA) against a portion of Wyoming's formula funding. These penalties can double in subsequent years after the first year. The amount of FHA funding revenue that would be preserved by avoiding these penalties is estimated by the Department of Transportation at approximately \$11.14 million in FY 2023 and \$22.28 million per year in subsequent years.

The fiscal impact to the judicial system is indeterminable due to an unknown number of cases.
