FISCAL NOTE

This bill would require runoff elections after primary elections for specified offices when no candidate receives a majority of the vote.

The bill would change the date of primary elections from the first Tuesday after the third Monday in August to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May in general election years. If required by W.S. 22-5-601 created in the bill, runoff elections would be held at the regular polling places for each necessary precinct on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in August in general election years.

Sections 1 and 2 of the bill would be effective only upon certification by the Secretary of State that the electors have adopted an amendment to the Wyoming Constitution at the 2022 general election revising the date of the reapportionment of the legislature, as provided in 2022 House Joint Resolution 3.
