for

1 AN ACT relating to the Hathaway scholarship program; amending award timing for the Hathaway scholarship program; 2 amending eligibility requirements as specified; amending 3 4 the calculation of unmet financial need; amending the calculation of scholarship amounts; deleting 5 obsolete 6 language; specifying applicability; repealing provisions; 7 and providing for an effective date.

16 (c) Any student receiving a scholarship under W.S 17 21-16-1304 or 21-16-1305 may elect to receive all or a portion of his remaining scholarship amount in any semester 18 in which the student is enrolled at an eligible 19 20 institution. The election shall be submitted to the eligible institution at the time of enrollment for an 21 academic term. The eligible institution shall calculate 22 the student's remaining scholarship amount in accordance 23

1 with W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(xxi) and shall include the amount,

2 <u>as limited in this subsection, in its certification of</u>

3 students under W.S. 21-16-1308. The department shall

4 review the amount certified for each student and include

5 the amount it determines to be in compliance with this

(c) A Hathaway expand Wyoming scholarship shall be 7 8 for the student's cost of attendance at an eligible institution, but not to exceed the maximum dollar amount 9 10 provided to students receiving a trustee scholarship at the 11 University of Wyoming and subject to reduction in accordance with W.S. 21-16-1309(a). No student shall be 12 eligible for a Hathaway expand Wyoming scholarship for more 13 than the equivalent of eight (8) full-time semesters. 14 Minimum continuing eligibility and reinstatement 15 16 eligibility requirements for A student receiving a Hathaway 17 expand Wyoming scholarship shall be the same as requirements for a Hathaway honors scholarship. These 18 19 minimum requirements may be increased by rule of the 20 department to requirements no more stringent than those imposed by the University of Wyoming for recipients of a 21 trustee scholarship. 1 Hathaway provisional opportunity scholarship pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1305(a)(i)(A), one thousand six hundred eighty 2 3 dollars (\$1,680.00) in any one (1) academic year, unless 4 the credential program is in an economic sector determined by the commission to fulfill a critical workforce need. 5 For credential programs in such economic sectors, the grant 6 amount shall not exceed the amount provided for two (2) 7 8 semesters under the Hathaway honor scholarship pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1304(a)(iii)(A) three thousand three hundred 9 10 sixty dollars (\$3,360.00) in any one (1) academic year. 11 One-half (1/2) of the annual award shall be provided to the 12 student at each fall and spring academic term of qualification, unless the credential program or course is 13 for a defined period of less than a full semester or the 14 student elects to reserve any portion of the annual award 15 16 for attendance at a subsequent summer school term. 17 credential programs of one (1) term or less, cost of attendance and unmet financial need shall be calculated on 18 a projected annual basis, but the annual award amount shall 19 20 be provided in full in the term of attendance, on a 21 prorated basis.

- 13 to Title 21, Chapter 16, Article 13 of the Wyoming Statutes
