- 12 submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at the
- 13 next general election for approval or rejection to become

valid as a part of the Constitution if ratified by a majority 1 2 of the electors at the election: 3 4 Article 3, Section 48 State census; special session. 5 At the first budget session Not later than December 10 of the 6 year that the legislature receives population data following 7 8 the federal census, the legislature shall reapportion its 9 membership based upon that census. Notwithstanding any other 10 provision of this article, any bill to apportion the 11 legislature may be introduced in a budget session in the same 12 manner as in a general session the presiding officers of each house shall, if necessary, jointly call a special session of 13 not longer than ten (10) working days for the sole purpose of 14 reapportioning its membership as required under this section. 15 16 17 Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse the following statement on the proposed amendment: 18 19 20 The adoption of this amendment would change the date that the 21 legislature is required to reapportion its membership based 22 upon the federal census and would require the legislature to 23 convene a special session if necessary to reapportion its

2 allow primary elections to be moved to May to accommodate

3 subsequent runoff elections as necessary.
