**Catch Title:** **Pre-application determinations for licensing.**

**Subject:** Determinations of impact of criminal convictions for licensing purposes.

**Summary/Major Elements:**

- This act provides that any person previously convicted of a criminal offense may, before undertaking the licensing process, apply to a board, commission, or authority that provides occupational licenses for a determination as to whether one or more criminal convictions will prevent the person from receiving a license, certification, or registration.
- As part of the pre-application determination process, a board, commission, or authority may request criminal history background information on the applicant.
- The board, commission, or authority completing the pre-application determination may charge a reasonable fee for providing the determination not to exceed the costs of providing the determination.
- Any pre-application determination issued by a board, commission, or authority regarding the impact of a future applicant's criminal convictions is not binding upon the board, commission, or authority.
