**Catch Title:** **Display of state flag.**  
**Subject:** Amending a condition from the 1945 Wyoming Session Laws restricting the display of an original Wyoming state flag.

**Summary/Major Elements:**

- On February 15, 1919, after the Daughters of the American Revolution's statewide competitive program to design the Wyoming state flag, the winning design was formally presented to the state in a Joint Session of the Legislature. Through oversight, the woman who submitted the winning design, Mrs. Verna Keyes, was not recognized.
- In 1945 the Wyoming Legislature presented Mrs. A.C. Keyes, then of Casper, with one of the six original flags as the property of, and to remain in the home or homes, of, herself and her heirs only, upon condition that it shall never be otherwise displayed.
- This act amends that original condition relating to the display of that original Wyoming state flag to allow Mrs. Keyes or her heirs to donate the flag for public display at a Wyoming state, county, or municipal building. The flag is presently displayed in Casper at the Natrona County Library.
- The act also corrects a typographical error, some grammar, and the spelling of Verna's maiden name, Keays.
- The act directs the state historian to deliver a copy of the act to the known heirs of Mrs. Verna Keyes.
