Description of appropriation:

This legislation establishes a temporary law enforcement drug-detection canine program to provide grants to law enforcement agencies to purchase and train drug-detection canines to detect fentanyl. The Attorney General's Office estimates \$25,000 over two fiscal years will be spent on administration and \$3,975,000 will be available for grant awards between July 1, 2023 and December 31, 2024. Any unexpended, unobligated funds from this appropriation revert to the General Fund on December 31, 2024.

The Attorney General's Office indicates it would establish a new Unit 0304 Fentanyl Drug Detection in the Division of Criminal Investigations for this purpose.
