Source of revenue increase:

The bill increases several limits for fees related to electrical inspections, permits and licenses, established by rule of the Department of Fire Prevention and Electrical Safety (Department).

## Assumptions:

The Department estimates that if current fees are increased to the maximum allowable limits under this bill, the increased fees would result in a total estimated revenue increase of \$967,565. The Department based its estimates on inspections performed and permits and licenses issued in calendar year 2022. The revenue increase is distributed sixty percent (60%) to the Department's Electrical Fees account and forty percent (40%) to the General Fund. The Department assumes the number of inspections performed and permits and licenses issued will be consistent for the next three years.

The Department notes that it currently does not charge fees for reinspections and that fees for renewal of electrician licenses are charged at 50%. The estimates above assume the maximum fees allowed under the bill will be charged, including fees for reinspections and license renewal.
