## A BILL

for 1 relating to state officials; creating AN ACT the independent commission on state officials' compensation; 2 providing for the appointment of members; providing for 3 terms of members on the commission; providing for reports; 4 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 5 6 date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 **Section 1**. W.S. 9-3-801 is created to read: 11

12 ARTICLE 8

13 STATE OFFICIALS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION

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9-3-801. Independent commission on state officials compensation.

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(a) There is created the independent commission on 2 state officials' compensation. The commission shall be 3 4 comprised of seven (7) members appointed as provided in this subsection. Members of the commission shall receive 5 per diem and mileage in the same amount as members of the 6 legislature while attending meetings of the commission. 7 Except as provided in this subsection, members of the 8 commission shall serve six (6) year terms. Members of the 9 10 commission may serve no more than two (2) consecutive 11 terms. Of the initial members appointed to the commission, 12 three (3) members shall serve six (6) year terms, two (2) 13 members shall serve four (4) year terms and two (2) members 14 shall serve two (2) year terms. The governor, president of the senate, speaker of the house of representatives and 15 16 chief justice of the supreme court shall jointly determine 17 the terms of the initial members appointed to commission. If a member of the commission resigns, a new 18 19 member shall be appointed for the remainder of 20 resigning member's term by the authority who appointed the 21 resigning member. Members of the commission shall be 22 qualified electors of the state of Wyoming and shall not hold any office or employment with the state of Wyoming 23

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- 1 while serving on the commission. Members of the commission
- 2 may be removed by the authority who appointed the member.
- 3 Members of the commission shall be appointed as follows:

- 5 (i) Three (3) members of the commission shall be
- 6 appointed by the governor;

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- 8 (ii) Two (2) members of the commission shall be
- 9 appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court;

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- 11 (iii) One (1) member of the commission shall be
- 12 appointed by the president of the senate;

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- 14 (iv) One (1) member of the commission shall be
- 15 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

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- 17 (b) The commission shall meet not less than two (2)
- 18 times during every term of the legislature to receive all
- 19 information the commission deems relevant to determine the
- 20 appropriate salary recommendations to provide to the
- 21 legislature. The commission shall make its recommendations
- 22 as to the appropriate salary to be provided to each
- 23 official included in subsection (d) of this section to the

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- 1 management council of the legislature and the joint
- 2 appropriations committee not later than December first of
- 3 each odd numbered year.

- 5 (c) When making recommendations to the management
- 6 council and the joint appropriations committee for
- 7 compensation adjustments pursuant to this section, the
- 8 commission shall consider any factors it considers
- 9 relevant, including:

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- 11 (i) The level of compensation necessary to
- 12 attract individuals who are qualified to serve in an
- 13 official position to seek nomination for the position;

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- 15 (ii) The percentage average adjustment of
- 16 salaries provided to executive branch employees since the
- 17 last adjustment to an official's compensation;

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- 19 (iii) The percentage change in the Wyoming
- 20 cost-of-living index published by the economic analysis
- 21 division of the department of administration and
- 22 information since the last adjustment to an official's
- 23 compensation;

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2 (iv) For a member of the legislature, the total 3 compensation necessary to encourage candidates to seek 4 election which would produce a legislature that is representative of the Wyoming electorate as a whole; 5 6 7 (v) For a justice of the supreme court, district 8 court judge, circuit court judge or district attorney, the 9 average market pay in Wyoming of an attorney qualified to serve in those official positions. 10 11 Pursuant to the requirements of the Wyoming 12 13 constitution and subsection (c) of this section, the commission shall recommend salary and other compensation 14 adjustments to the management council and the 15 joint 16 appropriations committee for the following officials: 17 18 (i) Governor; 19 20 (ii) Secretary of state; 21 22 (iii) Auditor;

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1 (iv) Treasurer; 2 3 (v) Superintendent of public instruction; 4 (vi) Members of the legislature; 5 6 7 (vii) Justices of the supreme court; 8 9 (viii) District court judges; 10 11 (ix) Circuit court judges; 12 13 (x) District attorneys. 14 The commission shall be staffed by 15 (e) the legislative service office with the assistance of 16 17 governor's office, the supreme court and the department of administration and information. 18 19 20 Section 2. There is appropriated five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) from 21 the general fund to the legislative service office to pay the per diem and mileage 22 for members of the state officials compensation commission 23

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1 from the effective date of this act through June 30, 2024.

2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this

3 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

4 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds

5 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

6 by law on July 1, 2024.

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8 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
