1 AN ACT relating to defense forces and affairs; adopting uniform definitions of armed forces and uniformed services 2 3 to align with federal law; expanding uniformed service members entitled to participate in programs under state 4 law; making conforming amendments; and providing for an 5 6 effective date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 8-1-102(a) by creating new paragraphs 11 (xxi) and (xxii), 19-11-103(a)(xi), 19-11-108(a), (b) and 12 (e), 19-11-112(b), 19-11-122(a), 19-11-202, 19-13-102(a)(ii), 19-14-106(a)(i), (ii)(A) and (B), 13 14 19-14-111(d)(ii), 20-2-205(f)(iv), 21-17-105(f), 15 21-17-122(d), 21-24-102(a)(xviii), 23-1-705(e)(iii),

Definitions. 11 12 (a) As used in this article, unless the context 13 clearly requires otherwise: 14 15 (xi) "Uniformed services" means the armed 16 17 forces, the army national guard and the air national guard of any state, the commissioned corps of the public health 18 19 service and any other category of persons designated by the 20 president in time of war or emergency as defined in W.S. 21 8-1-102(a)(xxii);

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19-11-108. Leave of absence for state, city or county
 officers and employees; training programs.

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4 (a) Any member of the national guard of any state or United States military armed forces reserve who is an 5 6 officer or employee of this state or any political subdivision, municipal corporation or any public agency or 7 entity of the state, including community colleges, shall 8 be given a military leave of absence with pay at the 9 10 regular salary or wage which the employee normally receives, not to exceed fifteen (15) calendar days in any 11 12 one (1) calendar year to perform service in the uniformed 13 services in addition to any other leave or vacation time to which the person is otherwise entitled. 14

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16 (b) Subject to the conditions prescribed in paragraphs (c)(i) through (v) of this section, any officer 17 or employee of the state or any political subdivision, 18 19 municipal corporation or public agency of the state who has 20 been employed for one (1) year and who is a member of the 21 national guard of any state or any other component of the military forces of a state, a member of the reserve armed 22 23 forces of the United States or who is inducted into the

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military service armed forces of the United States, is 1 2 entitled to leave of absence from his public office or 3 employment without pay but without loss of seniority, 4 status, efficiency rating, vacation, sick leave or other benefits while he is engaged in active military training or 5 service ordered or authorized by proper authority pursuant 6 to law exceeding fifteen (15) days in any calendar year. 7 8 Such leave is in addition to any other military leave or vacation time to which the officer or employee may be 9 10 entitled by law if the required military service is satisfactorily performed, which is presumed unless the 11 12 contrary is established.

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(e) This section shall be liberally construed in
favor of the member of the national guard of any state or
United States military armed forces who is an officer or
employee of this state or any political subdivision,
municipal corporation or any public agency of this state.

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22 (b) No employee shall receive more than a total of 23 five (5) years of military service uniformed services

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credit in the retirement system, pension fund or employee
 benefit plan applicable to his employment credited under
 this section.

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5 19-11-122. Servicemembers Civil Relief Act; 6 application to national guard; penalty for violation of 7 rights; enforcement; preferences.

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9 (a) Members of the Wyoming national guard ordered to 10 active state service by the state or federal government for a period of more than thirty (30) consecutive days shall 11 12 have all protections afforded to persons in the military service armed forces of the United States under the 13 Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, Public Law 14 108-189. 15 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, 16 nothing in this subsection shall be construed to authorize 17 the imposition of any penalty under the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act for violation of the protections afforded 18 19 to members of the Wyoming national guard pursuant to this 20 subsection. As used in this subsection, "active state 21 service" means as defined in W.S. 19-7-101(a)(v).

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19-11-202. Acknowledgment of instrument by members of
 armed forces and their dependents before commissioned
 officer; form of certificate.

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In addition to the acknowledgment of instruments in the 5 manner and form otherwise authorized by law, persons who 6 perform service in the uniformed services or their 7 8 dependents, wherever located, may acknowledge the instruments before any commissioned officer who performs 9 10 service in the uniformed services with the rank of second lieutenant or higher in the army, air force, or marine 11 12 corps<sub>7</sub> or space force or ensign or higher in the navy or coast guard. The instrument is not invalid for failure to 13 state therein the place of execution or acknowledgment. No 14 15 authentication of the officer's certificate of acknowledgment is required, but the officer taking the 16 17 acknowledgment shall endorse thereon or attach thereto a certificate substantially in the following form: 18

Definitions. 16 17 (a) As used in this act: 18 19 20 (ii) "Homeland security" means the preparation for and the carrying out of all emergency functions 21 essential to the recovery and restoration of the economy by 22 supply and resupply of resources to meet urgent survival 23

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and military needs, other than functions for which military 1 2 armed forces are primarily responsible, necessary to deal 3 with disasters caused by enemy attack, sabotage, terrorism, 4 civil disorder or other hostile action, or by fire, flood, earthquake, other natural causes and other technological, 5 industrial, civil and political events. These functions 6 include without limitation 7 the coordination of fire-fighting services, police services, medical and health 8 9 services, rescue, engineering, attack warning services, 10 communications, radiological events, evacuation of persons from stricken areas, emergency welfare services (civilian 11 12 war aid), emergency transportation, existing or properly 13 assigned functions of plant protection, temporary restoration of public utility services, mitigation 14 activities in areas threatened by natural or technological 15 16 hazards, and other functions related to civilian protection, together with all other activities necessary or 17 18 incidental to the preparation for any carrying out of the 19 foregoing functions;

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4 (d) Any claimant who is honorably discharged from 5 military service armed forces and files a claim after the 6 fourth Monday in May is entitled to receive the exemption 7 for that taxable year in addition to the exemption allowed 8 during the ensuing tax year if a claim is filed on or 9 before the fourth Monday in May of the ensuing calendar 10 year.
