A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to public funds; amending or eliminating 2 unnecessary or obsolete borrowing authority or guarantees from the legislative stabilization reserve account 3 as specified; repealing interfund loan authority for the 4 5 unemployment compensation fund; repealing borrowing 6 authority for the department of administration and 7 information for purposes of school districts joining the state employees' and officials' group insurance plan; 8 amending the source and amount of loans for the department 9 10 of transportation as specified; making conforming 11 amendments; and providing for an effective date.

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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4 9-1-418. Legislative stabilization reserve account

Section 1. W.S. 9-1-418 and 21-7-301(b) are amended

5 loans; maximum amount; repayment.

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The state auditor is authorized to borrow from the 7 8 legislative stabilization reserve account an amount not to 9 exceed two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) one 10 hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000.00) at any one (1) 11 meet the obligations of the department time to transportation which come due prior to the receipt of 12 revenues. The amounts borrowed under this section shall be 13 repaid as soon as the anticipated revenue is received. 14 Interest on the unpaid balance shall be equal to the rate 15 16 of return earned on pooled fund investments the legislative 17 stabilization reserve account in the previous fiscal year. These loans shall not be used to fund shortages caused by 18 19 expenditures exceeding projected revenues but are to be 20 used only to fund temporary shortages caused by meeting

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obligations which come due prior to receipt of revenues.

- 5 which is a participating district in the state employees'

- 9 employees meeting the definition of employee under W.S.
- 10 9-3-203(a)(iv), as provided by W.S. 9-3-202 through
- 11 9-3-218. Each participating school district shall report
- 12 to the department of administration and information as
- 13 specified by W.S. 9-3-205(e) and make payments for employer
- 14 and employee contributions as provided by W.S. 9-3-210 and
- 15 9-3-211. The amount of contributions paid under W.S.
- 16 9-3-211 for each employee electing coverage shall be
- 17 deducted from the employee's monthly salary in accordance
- 18 with W.S. 9-3-211.
