A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to alcohol; specifying that a licensee may
2 purchase alcoholic beverages from a retail licensee or a
3 manufacturer; and providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 12-2-303(d) and 12-4-201(j)(intro)
8 are amended to read:

9

10 **12-2-303. Purchase and sale of alcoholic liquors;**
11 **shortages.**

13 (d) The holder of a manufacturer's license under W.S.
14 12-2-203(a) that sells alcoholic liquor not obtained

1 through the division as provided in W.S. 12-2-203(g) or
2 12-4-201(j) shall, before the transfer of the product, ~~to a~~
3 ~~satellite location,~~ remit to the division an assessment in
4 an amount equal to the profit allowed under subsection (a)
5 of this section and the associated excise tax assessed
6 under W.S. 12-3-101 that would have been received by the
7 division had the holder of a manufacturer's license first
8 obtained the alcoholic liquor from the division as provided
9 in subsection (a) of this section. The department shall by
10 rule define the procedure under which a holder of a
11 manufacturer's license shall report and remit the
12 assessment under this subsection.

14 **12-4-201. Retail liquor licenses and malt beverage**
15 **permits; population formulas; fees.**

17 (j) Licensees authorized to sell alcoholic liquors ~~at~~
18 ~~retail~~ may purchase for resale not more than nine (9)
19 liters of alcoholic liquors per week from a retail licensee
20 authorized pursuant to this section or from the holder of a
21 manufacturer's license under W.S. 12-2-203(a) who is a
22 federally licensed distiller or rectifier. Purchases of

1 alcoholic liquors authorized pursuant to this subsection
2 shall be conducted in accordance with the following:
