9 **Section 1**. W.S. 26-20-702 is created to read:

- 15 substance use disorder benefits means benefits for the

1 treatment of any condition or disorder that involves a

2 mental health condition or substance use disorder that

3 falls under any of the diagnostic categories listed in the

4 mental disorders section of the most recent edition of the

5 International Classification of Disease or that is listed

6 in the mental disorders section of the most recent version

7 of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental
