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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-3-115(a)(vi), 22-5-212 and
- 8 22-5-214 are amended to read:

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10 22-3-115. Grounds for cancellation of registration.

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12 (a) A registered elector's registration shall be

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13 cancelled for any one (1) of the following reasons:

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1 (vi) Upon written request of the elector at any time except for the period for which party changes are 2 3 prohibited as specified in W.S. 22-5-214. 4 5 22-5-212. When declaration of party affiliation required. 6 7 8 An elector requesting a major party ballot must shall declare <u>his</u> or change party affiliation, or sign an 9 10 application for change of affiliation in accordance with 11 W.S. 22-5-214 before he may receive receiving a party ballot. An elector may vote only the nonpartisan ballot and 12 if so, is not required to declare his party affiliation. 13 Requesting a partisan primary election ballot constitutes a 14 15 declaration of party affiliation. A change in declaration 16 of party affiliation shall be in accordance with the 17 requirements of W.S. 22-5-214 and shall be entered on the 18 poll list by the election judge. 19 20 22-5-214. Declaration or change in party affiliation. 21 22 (a) For a primary election, an elector may declare or

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change party affiliation by completing an application

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1 signed before a notarial officer or election official and

2 filing it with the county clerk before the first day on

3 which an application for nomination may be filed under W.S.

4 22-5-209.

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(b) For a general election, an elector may declare or 6 7 change his-party affiliation by completing an application

8 signed before a notarial officer or election official, and

filing it with the county clerk after the primary election 9

10 and not less than fourteen (14) days before the primary

11 general election or at the polls on the day of the primary

12 or general election, or when requesting an absentee ballot

13 for the general election.

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Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 15 16 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 17 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Constitution.
