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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 26-20-803 is created to read:

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10 26-20-803. Living organ donor coverage.

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12 (a) No individual or group life insurance policy or

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13 long-term care insurance policy shall:

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1 (i) Deny or cancel coverage to a covered person 2 solely on the basis of the person's status as a living 3 organ donor; 4 5 (ii) Deny a covered person eligibility continued eligibility to enroll or to renew coverage under 6 the terms of a policy, contract or certificate, solely on 7 8 the basis of the person's status as a living organ donor; 9 10 (iii) Reduce or limit coverage or benefits, increase the premiums or otherwise adversely affect the 11 12 coverage or cost for a covered person's policy, contract or 13 certificate solely on the basis of the person's status as a 14 living organ donor without any additional separate 15 actuarial risk involved; 16 17 (iv) Preclude a covered person from donating all or part of an organ or tissues as a condition of receiving 18 19 or continuing to receive coverage under a policy, contract 20 or certificate. 21 Section 2. Definitions. 3 4 (a) As used in this article: 5 (i) "Covered person" means a policyholder, 6 subscriber, enrollee, member or individual covered by any 7 8 policy, contract or certificate listed in W.S. 26-20-802(a) or by any life insurance or long-term care insurance 9 10 policy; 11 12 (iii) "Living organ donor" means a person who is not deceased and who has donated all or part of one (1) or 13 more of the person's own organs or tissues to another 14 15 person for transplant. 16 17 Section 3. This act shall apply to any individual or group life insurance or long-term care insurance contract 18 or policy offered, issued, renewed, delivered or issued for 19 20 delivery in this state on or after July 1, 2023.

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1 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
