1 AN ACT relating to agriculture, livestock and other animals; requiring the Wyoming livestock board to establish 2 3 a communication protocol to provide information related to brucellosis testing; requiring the state veterinarian to 4 5 provide information to livestock regarding owners б brucellosis testing; making a conforming amendment; requiring rulemaking; and providing for effective dates. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 11-18-103(a) by creating a new 11 paragraph (xii), 11-18-117(b) and 11-19-102(a)(vi), (vii) 12 13 and by creating a new paragraph (viii) and by creating a new subsection (f) are amended to read: 14

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1 2 11-18-103. Livestock board; powers generally. 3 4 (a) In addition to powers and duties hereinafter 5 provided, the Wyoming livestock board shall: 6 7 (xii) Promulgate rules to establish a standard 8 communication protocol to inform all livestock producers, 9 veterinarians and brand inspectors in the county where a 10 non-negative brucellosis test has been confirmed for any 11 animal. 12 11-18-117. Confidentiality of livestock premises and 13 identification records; penalties. 14 15 16 (b) The Wyoming livestock board may release any 17 information related to a confirmed non-negative brucellosis 18 test in the county where the animal testing non-negative is 19 located, subject to W.S. 11-18-103(a)(xii), and may release 20 information collected for the purposes of a livestock 21 identification program related to the ownership and location of individual animals to 22 the extent the 23 information is useful in controlling or preventing a

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disease outbreak or to show particular animals or herds are not involved in a disease outbreak. The information released may be a public release or may be limited to specific individuals with a need to know the information, as the livestock board deems the circumstances require.

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7 11-19-102. Duty of public to report diseases; list of
8 reportable diseases; failure to comply or obstruction of
9 duty; liability; penalties.

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11 Any person or government entity who knows (a) or 12 suspects that there is any contagious or infectious reportable disease among animals owned by or under their 13 jurisdiction or any veterinarian who knows or suspects any 14 15 reportable contagious or infectious disease on any premises 16 or in any animal, shall immediately report the same to the 17 state veterinarian. The state veterinarian shall establish 18 and manage a list of reportable diseases for any contagious or infectious disease deemed by the state veterinarian to 19 20 be a threat to domestic animals. During development of this list the state veterinarian shall consult with the Wyoming 21 fish department's supervisor of veterinary 22 qame and 23 research services. Information collected in response to

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1	the list of reportable diseases shall be considered
2	confidential proprietary information. Access to any
3	information collected under the list of reportable diseases
4	shall be limited to the person who reported the disease and
5	the state veterinarian, except that the state veterinarian
6	may at his discretion notify any of the following:
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8	(vi) Adjacent landowners;—or

10	(vii) Local area practicing veterinarians <mark>;</mark> - <u>or</u>
11	
12	(viii) Owners of animals that have or may have
13	contracted any contagious or infectious disease.
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15	(f) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section,
16	the state veterinarian shall provide testing information to
17	the owner of an animal that has tested non-negative for
18	brucellosis not later than three (3) days after laboratory
19	confirmation.
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21	Section 2. The Wyoming livestock board shall
22	promulgate all rules necessary to implement the provisions

23 of this act.

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4	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
5	section, this act is effective July 1, 2023.
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7	(b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective
8	immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a
9	bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of
10	the Wyoming Constitution.
