Definitions of wildlife. 21 22 (a) As used in this act: 23

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1 2 (viii) "Predatory animal" means: 3 4 (B) Until the date gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental nonessential population, 5 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 6 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, "predatory animal" includes 7 8 wolves. After that date, "predatory animal" shall include any gray wolf within areas of the state where the state of 9 10 Wyoming has jurisdiction for wildlife management, but not 11 within an area of the state in which the gray wolf is: 12 13 (I) Designated as a trophy large carnivore game animal under subdivision (xii)(B)(I) or (II) 14 15 of this subsection. 16 17 (xii) "Trophy Large carnivore game animal" 18 means: 19 20 (B) From and after the date gray wolves are list of experimental nonessential 21 removed from the population, endangered species or threatened species in 22 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108: 23

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1 2 (I) "Trophy Large carnivore game 3 animal" shall include any gray wolf within those tracts of 4 land within the following described area: northwest Wyoming beginning at the junction of Wyoming Highway 120 and the 5 Wyoming-Montana state line; southerly along Wyoming Highway 6 120 to the Greybull River; southwesterly up said river to 7 8 the Wood River; southwesterly up said river to the Shoshone 9 National Forest boundary; southerly along said boundary to 10 the Wind River Indian Reservation boundary; westerly, then southerly along said boundary to the Continental Divide; 11 12 southeasterly along said divide to the Middle Fork of 13 Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to the Bridger-Teton National 14 15 Forest boundary; northwesterly along said boundary to its 16 intersection with U.S. Highway 189-191; northwesterly along 17 said highway to the intersection with U.S. Highway 26-89-191; northerly along said highway to Wyoming Highway 18 19 22 in the town of Jackson; westerly along said highway to 20 the Wyoming-Idaho state line; north along said state line 21 to the southern boundary of Yellowstone National Park; east and north along said boundary to the Wyoming-Montana state 22

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1 line; then east along said state line to Wyoming Highway 2 120;

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4 (II) "Trophy Large carnivore game animal" shall include any gray wolf located, from October 5 15 through the last day of February in the subsequent year, 6 within the following described area: beginning at the 7 8 boundary described in subdivision (B)(I) of this paragraph, 9 where the Bridger-Teton National Forest boundary intersects 10 U.S. Highway 189-191 at Hoback Rim; westerly and then 11 southerly along said forest boundary to its intersection 12 with USFS Road 10125 (McDougal Gap Road); westerly along said road to USFS Road 10138 (Grey's River Road); southerly 13 along said road to Sheep Creek; westerly down said creek to 14 Grey's River; southwesterly up said river to Bear Creek; 15 16 southwesterly up said creek to the hydrographic divide 17 between Bear Creek and Willow Creek; west from said divide to USFS Road 10080 (Willow Creek Road); northwesterly along 18 19 said road to Lincoln County Road 123; southerly along said 20 road to USFS Road 10081 (Grover Park Road); southerly then 21 westerly along said road to Lincoln County Road 172; westerly along said road to the junction with Wyoming 22 Highway 237; westerly along said highway to Wyoming Highway 23

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8 23-1-103. Ownership of wildlife; purpose of 9 provisions.

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11 For the purpose of this act, all wildlife in Wyoming is the 12 property of the state. It is the purpose of this act and the policy of the state to provide an adequate and flexible 13 system for control, propagation, management, protection and 14 regulation of all Wyoming wildlife. There shall be no 15 16 private ownership of live animals classified in this act as 17 big or trophy large carnivore game animals or of any wolf 18 or wolf hybrid.

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20 23-1-302. Powers and duties.

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22 (a) The commission is directed and empowered:23

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1 (ii) To establish zones and areas in which 2 trophy large carnivore game animals may be taken as game 3 animals with a license or, with the exception of gray 4 wolves, in the same manner as predatory animals without a 5 license, giving proper regard to the livestock and game industries in those particular areas; 6 7 8 (xxvi) To regulate or prohibit the importation 9 of exotic species, small game animals, furbearing animals, 10 protected animals, game birds, migratory birds, protected 11 birds, and fish into Wyoming, and to regulate and permit 12 the importation of big or trophy large carnivore game 13 animals into Wyoming only for exhibition purposes or for 14 zoos;

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16 (xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed 17 from the list of experimental nonessential population, 18 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 19 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to set seasons and bag limits 20 for gray wolves designated as trophy_large carnivore game 21 animals pursuant to W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I) and (II), 22 and to regulate the number of gray wolves which may be

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- 1 taken under a license issued under this act or as necessary 2 to carry out the commission's duties under this act;
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4 (p) The commission may, by rule and regulation, establish a process by which big game licenses, trophy 5 large carnivore game licenses and wild bison licenses may 6 be issued by a competitive raffle and prescribe the manner 7 8 of payment for which raffle chances are sold and the amount 9 of payment for each raffle chance. No more than two (2) 10 licenses for each big game species and trophy large 11 carnivore game species and no more than two (2) wild bison 12 licenses shall be issued under this subsection. Each 13 license issued for bighorn sheep, moose, mountain goat, grizzly bear or wild bison through a competitive raffle 14 15 shall, when applicable, be counted against any nonresident 16 quota. The five (5) year restriction imposed on the receipt 17 of a moose or bighorn sheep license by W.S. 23-1-703(b) or the lifetime restriction imposed on the receipt of a 18 19 grizzly bear, mountain goat, bighorn sheep, wild bison or 20 moose license by W.S. 23-1-703(c), and any restriction 21 imposed on the receipt of a wild bison license by W.S. 23-2-107 shall not be applicable in any manner to a license 22 issued pursuant to this subsection. The commission shall 23

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1 issue licenses upon receipt of the proper license fee by 2 the successful competitive raffle winner. Nothing in this 3 subsection shall authorize the issuance of a license to any 4 person whose privilege to procure, purchase or possess a 5 license has been suspended pursuant to this act or by operation of law. б 7 8 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves. 9 (a) The commission shall by rule and regulation set 10 11 seasons and bag limits within those areas where gray wolves 12 are designated as trophy large carnivore game animals 13 pursuant to W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I) and (II). The seasons and bag limits shall be set annually in a manner 14 the commission determines, through rule and regulation, as 15 16 necessary to reasonably ensure at least ten (10) breeding 17 pairs of gray wolves and a total of at least one hundred (100) individual gray wolves are located in this state 18 19 outside of Yellowstone National Park and the Wind River

Indian Reservation at the end of the current calendar year.

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1 (d) The department shall institute and maintain an 2 active program of population monitoring statewide subject 3 to the following:

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5 (i) Population monitoring shall include 6 techniques that accurately determine the population and 7 movement of gray wolves in areas of the state where gray 8 wolves are designated as trophy <u>large carnivore</u> game 9 animals;

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11 (iv) In areas of the state where gray wolves are 12 designated as trophy <u>large carnivore</u> game animals, any 13 person who takes a wolf shall notify the department of the 14 take and where the take occurred within a time period set 15 by rule and regulation, which shall not exceed seventy-two 16 (72) hours;

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(v) In areas of the state where gray wolves are designated as <u>trophy_large carnivore</u> game animals, any person who takes a wolf shall submit the wolf or parts thereof, as defined by rule and regulation, to the department for inspection within a time period established by rule and regulation which will not exceed ten (10) days;

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2 (h) Within forty-eight (48) hours of receiving 3 notification from a landowner or his designee that any gray 4 wolf in those areas of the state where gray wolves are designated as trophy large carnivore game animals has 5 harassed, injured, maimed or killed livestock or б any domesticated animal, the department shall respond 7 and 8 initiate appropriate management actions. The department may use the management techniques authorized 9 under 10 subsection (g) of this section or any other management 11 methods necessary, to minimize the harassing, injuring, 12 maiming or killing of livestock and other domesticated animals in those areas of the state where gray wolves are 13 designated as trophy large carnivore game animals. 14 15 16 23-1-703. Limitation of number of certain licenses; 17 reservation of certain licenses; reservation of certain

- 18 unused licenses.
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(a) The commission may limit the number of resident
or nonresident big or trophy large carnivore game animal
licenses or wild bison licenses to be sold in any calendar
year and may designate dates after which one (1) or more

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classes of licenses will not be sold except as authorized
 by the commission.

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4 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, no person may apply for and receive more than one (1) cow or 5 calf moose or one (1) ewe or lamb bighorn sheep license in 6 any consecutive five (5) year period. Licenses issued under 7 8 this subsection shall be issued partially through a 9 preference point drawing and partially through a random 10 drawing of all remaining unsuccessful applicants for that 11 year. The department shall assign points to each license 12 applicant for a specific species by multiplying the number 13 of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a license times one (1). The calculation used to assign 14 15 points to an applicant for a particular species under this 16 subsection shall include any year the applicant does not 17 apply for a big or trophy large carnivore game animal 18 hunting license for that species, provided in the case of a resident the applicant pays the fee specified in W.S. 19 20 23-2-101(k), and in the case of a nonresident, the 21 applicant pays the appropriate fee established by the 22 commission under W.S. 23-2-101(m). License applicants 23 within each hunt area for a species shall be grouped

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according to the number of assigned points 1 for that 2 species. Not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of available licenses within any hunt area shall be randomly 3 4 selected through a preference point drawing from among the 5 group of applicants with the largest number of assigned points and shall continue until all applicants within that 6 group have been exhausted or until all available licenses 7 8 have been issued, whichever first occurs. If any applicant 9 grouping has been exhausted and licenses remain available 10 within that hunt area, selection shall continue from among 11 the group of applicants with the next largest number of 12 assigned points. After the selections through the preference point drawing have been completed within a hunt 13 area, the remaining licenses available from that drawing 14 and the licenses available for the random drawing for that 15 16 hunt area will be issued through a random selection from 17 among all applicants in the hunt area who were not selected for issuance of a license for the species through the 18 19 preference point drawing in that hunt area. For purposes of 20 assigning points under this subsection, any unsuccessful 21 license applicant failing to apply for a license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of applying, during the second 22 calendar year shall be considered to be a first year 23

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applicant for any subsequent calendar year in which the
 applicant submits license application for that particular
 species.

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(f) Notwithstanding W.S. 23-1-704, 23-2-101(j) and 5 23-2-107(e), any person who is issued and purchases a 6 license listed in paragraph (i) of this subsection, but who 7 does not use the license, may reserve a license for the 8 9 particular species and sex of animal designated on the 10 unused license for use during the immediately succeeding 11 hunting season by applying to the commission in accordance 12 with commission rules as provided in this subsection. Upon receipt of an application that establishes the conditions 13 listed in paragraphs (i) through (iv) of this subsection, 14 the commission shall cancel the initial license and prior 15 16 to the subsequent season opening date for the designated 17 species and sex of animal, issue to the applicant at an administrative cost of ten dollars (\$10.00), a license for 18 19 the designated animal valid for that season. A person may 20 apply for and reserve a license under this subsection only 21 if all the following conditions exist:

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(i) The license is one (1) of the following:

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1 2 (B) A trophy large carnivore game animal 3 license; 4 23-1-705. Complimentary licenses; pioneer licenses; 5 antelope hunt licenses; gunpowder and buckskin б hunt 7 licenses; gratuitous licenses; donated licenses. 8 9 (k) The holder of any valid big game animal license, 10 trophy large carnivore game animal license, any wild bison license or a female or calf wild bison license may 11 12 surrender said license to the department for reissuance to 13 a veteran with disabilities or a person with a permanent 14 disability who uses a wheelchair as established by 15 commission rule and regulation selected and sponsored by a 16 nonprofit charitable organization providing hunting 17 opportunities to a veteran with disabilities or a person with a permanent disability who uses a wheelchair. 18 Any 19 license reissued in accordance with the provisions of this 20 subsection shall be for the same species, area and license type as the license donated. The license shall be reissued 21 22 by the department to a qualifying person at no fee. Any 23 license donated and reissued under the provisions of this

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subsection shall not be sold, traded, auctioned or offered 1 for any monetary value and shall not be issued to, or used 2 3 by, any person other than a qualifying person under the 4 provision of this section and in compliance with commission rule and regulation. Licenses reissued to persons pursuant 5 to this subsection shall not be subject to residency, б drawing or fee requirements under W.S. 23-2-101 7 or 8 23-2-107. The five (5) year restriction imposed on the 9 receipt of a cow or calf moose or a ewe or lamb bighorn 10 sheep license by W.S. 23-1-703(b), the lifetime restriction 11 imposed on the receipt of a grizzly bear, mountain goat, 12 ram or any bighorn sheep, any wild bison or any moose or 13 antlered moose license by W.S. 23-1-703(c) or the restrictions imposed on a wild bison under W.S. 23-2-107(f) 14 15 shall not be applicable in any manner to a license issued 16 pursuant to this subsection.

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18 23-1-901. Owner of damaged property to report damage; 19 claims for damages; time for filing; determination; appeal; 20 arbitration.

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(a) Any landowner, lessee or agent whose property is
being damaged by any of the big or trophy_large carnivore

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1 game animals or game birds of this state shall, not later 2 than fifteen (15) days after the damage is discovered by 3 the owner of the property or the representative of the 4 owner, report the damage to the nearest game warden, damage 5 control warden, supervisor or commission member.

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(b) Any landowner, lessee or agent claiming damages 7 from the state for injury or destruction of property by big 8 or trophy large carnivore game animals or game birds of 9 10 this state shall present a verified claim for the damages to the Wyoming game and fish department not later than 11 12 sixty (60) days after the damage or last item of damage is discovered. The claim shall specify the damage and amount 13 claimed. As used in this subsection, "verified claim" 14 means a claim which the claimant has signed and sworn to be 15 16 accurate before a person authorized to administer oaths.

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18 (c) The department shall consider the claims based 19 upon a description of the livestock or bees damaged or 20 killed by a trophy_large carnivore game animal, the damaged 21 land, growing cultivated crops, stored crops including 22 honey and hives, seed crops, improvements and extraordinary 23 damage to grass. The commission is authorized to establish

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by rule, methods, factors and formulas to be used for 1 2 determining the amount to compensate any landowner, lessee 3 or agent for livestock damaged as a result of, missing as a 4 result of, or killed by trophy large carnivore game animals. Claims shall be investigated by the department and 5 rejected or allowed within ninety (90) days after 6 submission, and paid in the amount determined to be due. In 7 8 the event the department fails to act within ninety (90) days, the claim, including interest based on local bank 9 10 preferred rates, shall be deemed to have been allowed. No 11 award shall be allowed to any landowner who has not 12 permitted hunting on his property during authorized hunting 13 seasons. Any person failing to comply with any provision of this section is barred from making any claim against the 14 15 department for damages. Any claimant aggrieved by the decision of the department may appeal to the commission 16 17 within thirty (30) days after receipt of the decision of the department as provided by rules of practice and 18 19 procedure promulgated by the commission. The commission 20 shall review the department decision at its next meeting 21 following receipt of notice of request for review. The commission shall review the investigative report of the 22

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department, and it may approve, modify or reverse the
 decision of the department.

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23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application
fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency
required; donation of refunded application fees.

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8 (d) The commission may issue big or trophy large carnivore game licenses in areas in which all licenses 9 10 initially authorized were not purchased or in which 11 additional harvest is desired, allowing a licensee to take 12 a big or trophy large carnivore game animal of such sex or age as designated by the commission. The fee for the 13 license may be reduced by the commission to the level 14 15 necessary to achieve the desired management objectives, but 16 in no case shall a resident or nonresident license fee be 17 less than the landowner's coupon fee.

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(e) Resident and nonresident license applicants shall
pay an application fee in an amount specified by this
subsection upon submission of an application for purchase
of any limited quota drawing for big or trophy large
carnivore game license or wild bison license. The resident

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application fee shall be five dollars (\$5.00) and the 1 2 nonresident application fee shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00). The application fee is in addition to the fees 3 4 prescribed by subsections (f) and (j) of this section and 5 by W.S. 23-2-107 and shall be payable to the department either directly or through an authorized selling agent of 6 the department. At the beginning of each month, the 7 8 commission shall set aside all of the fees collected during 9 calendar year 1980 and not to exceed twenty-five percent 10 (25%) of the fees collected thereafter pursuant to this subsection to establish and maintain a working balance of 11 12 five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00), to compensate 13 owners or lessees of property damaged by game animals and 14 game birds.

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16 (q) In addition to other fees under this section, persons applying for a license or tag under this section 17 may pay a voluntary fee of two dollars (\$2.00) or any 18 greater amount to fund predator control activities in the 19 20 state. The department shall provide information on the 21 license or tag application form that the applicant may pay the fee under this subsection. Any voluntary fees collected 22 23 pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited in a

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separate account within the game and fish fund and shall 1 2 only be expended as determined by the commission for and control of predator populations 3 management and 4 depredating animals. The commission may consider projects that mitigate damage caused to livestock, wildlife and 5 predatory animals, predacious birds 6 crops by and depredating animals or for the protection of human health 7 8 and safety and may also use these funds for the purposes specified in W.S. 11-6-307 and 23-1-901. As used in this 9 10 subsection, "depredating animal" means any trophy large 11 carnivore game animal or furbearing animal that causes 12 damage. 13 23-2-102. Age restrictions; game animals; game birds. 14 15 The minimum age to take any big or trophy large 16 (a) 17 carnivore game animal is twelve (12) years, except that any

person may take a big or trophy_large carnivore game animal at eleven (11) years of age if the person will attain twelve (12) years of age by the end of that calendar year. Any person authorized by this subsection under the age of fourteen (14) years shall at all times when hunting be accompanied by a person over the age of majority who

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possesses and can exhibit a certificate of competency and 1 safety as specified in W.S. 23-2-106 or who currently 2 3 holds, or has been issued a Wyoming big game hunting 4 license within the last five (5) years. If the person accompanying the hunter under the age of fourteen (14) 5 years is not the parent or guardian of the hunter, the 6 hunter shall have in his possession a permission slip 7 signed by his parent or guardian allowing him to hunt under 8 9 supervision. Each accompanying adult shall supervise not 10 more than one (1) hunter under the age of fourteen (14) 11 years. Any person under the age of fourteen (14) years 12 applying for a license to hunt big or trophy large carnivore game animals under this subsection shall have the 13 application for the license co-signed by his parent or 14 15 legal guardian.

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17 23-2-104. Archery licenses; special seasons;
18 prohibition against firearms; equipment.

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20 (b) The commission may establish special hunting 21 seasons for the taking of big game or trophy <u>large</u> 22 <u>carnivore</u> game animals by bow and arrow or crossbow in such 23 areas as it may establish by order.

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2 (c) No person shall hunt big game or trophy <u>large</u> 3 <u>carnivore</u> game with bow and arrow or crossbow during a 4 special archery hunting season without first obtaining an 5 archery license and the appropriate hunting license.

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7 (d) No person holding an archery license shall take 8 big game or trophy large carnivore game animals during a special archery hunting season or during a limited quota 9 10 archery only hunting season by the use of any type of 11 firearm. Any person who takes a big game or trophy-large 12 carnivore game animal by the use of a firearm during a special archery hunting season or during a limited quota 13 archery only hunting season is guilty of a high misdemeanor 14 punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(ii). 15 Upon 16 request by a game warden or other Wyoming law enforcement 17 officer, a person who has taken a big or trophy large carnivore game animal during a special archery hunting 18 season or during a limited quota archery only hunting 19 20 season shall allow testing of the animal's tissue for 21 confirmation of compliance with this section.

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1 commission shall establish by rule and (e) The 2 regulation specifications for crossbows, longbows, recurve 3 bows, compound bows, arrows and broadheads for taking of 4 big or trophy large carnivore game animals. The rules and 5 regulations promulgated under the provisions of this subsection relating to the hunting of big or trophy large 6 carnivore game animals shall also apply to the hunting of 7 8 the gray wolf as a trophy large carnivore game animal from 9 and after the date gray wolves are removed from the list of 10 experimental nonessential population, endangered species or 11 threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. 12

23-2-109. Multiple applications for limited licenses
 prohibited; penalty.

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16 Except as otherwise authorized by law or rule of the 17 commission, no person shall submit more than one (1) 18 application for a license for the same big or trophy large 19 carnivore game species or for wild turkey, if the issuance 20 of the license has been limited by the commission. A 21 violation of this subsection shall be punishable as a high misdemeanor punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(ii), 22 by the loss of all points then assigned to the person 23

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1 pursuant to W.S. 23-1-703(b) or (g), and disqualification 2 in the year of submission for any license for the species 3 for which the multiple applications were submitted. 4 5 23-2-307. Special management permit. б (a) The commission may by rule and regulation define 7 8 those special management programs which require additional 9 expenditures for the propagation, stocking or feeding of 10 wildlife, for designated trophy large carnivore management 11 areas and for hunting and fishing field development. Any 12 person participating in a special management program shall be required to purchase a special management permit for the 13 14 program. 15 16 23-2-401. The taking of each animal is a separate offense.
