Denturist practice act.

## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to professions and occupations; amending 2 dentists and dental hygienists licensing statutes to include denturists; authorizing a denturist to be added to 3 4 the board as specified; specifying that this act does not apply to denturitry students performing denturitry as part 5 of their curriculum; specifying that denturists shall only 6 7 perform dental laboratory work at the direction of a 8 dentist; specifying that denturists may perform services 9 for patients if trained to do so in a denturitry school accredited by the National Denturist Association or other 10 approved education program and under the supervision of a 11 amending requirements relating to permissible 12 dentist; 13 supervised work by specified persons; amending other laws 14 relating to dentists and dental hygienists to include denturists as specified; requiring rulemaking; providing an 15 16 appropriation; and providing for effective dates.

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1 "Health care professional" means any of the (i) 2 following who provide medical or dental diagnosis, care or 3 treatment: 4 (D) Dentists, and dental hygienists and 5 denturists licensed to practice as provided in title 33, 6 7 chapter 15 of the Wyoming statutes; and 8 33-15-101. Board of dental examiners; generally. 9 10 11 (c) No person is eligible to membership on the board 12 who is not legally qualified to practice; who has not engaged in the active practice of dentistry in the state of 13 Wyoming for at least five (5) continuous years immediately 14 prior to appointment; who does not at the time of his 15 16 appointment hold a certificate entitling him to practice 17 dentistry in the state of Wyoming; and who is not a resident of the state of Wyoming. One (1) appointed member 18 19 of the board shall be a dental hygienist who has the 20 qualifications provided in this act. One (1) appointed 21 member of the board may be a denturist who has the qualifications provided in this act. No member 22 shall

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succeed himself in office for more than two (2) successive
 terms.

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4 (e) Appointments by the governor to the board shall 5 be made from a list of recommended names submitted by the 6 Wyoming Dental Association, and Wyoming Dental Hygiene 7 Association and the Wyoming State Denturist Association if 8 applicable as follows:

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10 (i) The Wyoming Dental Association shall, 11 through its secretary, present to the governor within 12 fifteen (15) days after its regular annual meeting a list 13 of the names of not less than ten (10) candidates from 14 which appointments for vacancies on the board occurring 15 during the ensuing year shall be made; and

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(ii) The Wyoming Dental Hygiene Association shall, through its secretary, present to the governor within fifteen (15) days after its regular annual meeting a list of not less than three (3) candidates from which appointments for vacancies on the board occurring during the ensuing year shall be made<u>;</u> and

Any license granted by the 3 board shall expire if the holder fails to secure the 4 renewal certificate within three (3) months after the date 5 that the license renewal application is required to be 6 submitted.

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8 (b) Any dentist or denturist whose application for renewal indicates that the dentist or denturist has not 9 10 actively practiced dentistry or engaged in teaching dentistry, or dental hygiene or denturitry for the 11 12 preceding five (5) years shall be issued a renewal 13 certificate only after demonstrating to the board that the dentist or denturist has maintained the qualifications set 14 15 forth in this act. The board may require reexamination if 16 it finds good cause to believe that the person has not maintained the professional ability and knowledge required 17 18 of an original licensee.

The 18 19 holder shall not accept any form of remuneration for 20 providing dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry services while in possession of the certificate. The board may 21 revoke a volunteer's certificate on receiving proof 22 23 satisfactory to the board that the holder has engaged in

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practice in this state outside the scope of the
 certificate.

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4 (g) To be eligible for renewal of a volunteer's 5 certificate, the holder of the certificate shall certify to the board completion of any continuing education required 6 under this act as if the holder of the certificate were in 7 8 active practice. The board shall not renew a certificate if 9 the holder has not complied with the continuing education 10 requirements. The nonprofit health care facility in which 11 the holder provides dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry 12 services may pay for or reimburse the holder for any costs incurred in obtaining the required continuing education. 13

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15 (h) The board shall issue to each person who 16 qualifies under this section a volunteer's certificate that 17 states the certificate holder is authorized to provide dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry services pursuant 18 19 to the laws of this state.

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(j) Except as provided in this section, any person holding a volunteer's certificate issued by the board under this section shall be subject to the requirements of this

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act and the jurisdiction of the board as if he were 1 2 licensed to practice dentistry, or dental hygiene or 3 denturitry under this act. 4 5 33-15-133. 19 (a) If there are three (3) denturist candidates 20 interested in serving on the board of dental examiners, the 21 governor may appoint a denturist from the list of three (3) 22 candidates to the board of dental examiners pursuant to 23 this act not later than July 1, 2023.

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(b) If the governor appoints a denturist to the board 2 3 of dental examiners, the Wyoming State Denturist 4 Association shall present to the governor a list of not less than three (3) candidates from which appointments for 5 vacancies on the board of dental examiners occurring during б 7 the ensuing year shall be made pursuant to this act not 8 later than July 1, 2023. 9 10 Section 3. There is appropriated nine thousand 11 dollars (\$9,000.00) from special revenue to the board of 12 dental examiners to pay for administrative costs due to the implementation of this act for the period beginning the 13 effective date of this act through June 14 30, 2024. 15 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 16 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 17 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 18 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 19 by law on July 1, 2024.
