## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; providing for the
- 2 automatic restoration of voting rights for nonviolent
- 3 felons as specified; making conforming amendments;
- 4 repealing a provision; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-10-106(a)(iv) and 7-13-105(c) and
- 9 by creating a new subsection (f) are amended to read:

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11 6-10-106. Rights lost by conviction of felony;

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12 restoration.

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- 1 (a) A person convicted of a felony is incompetent to
- 2 be an elector or juror or to hold any office of honor,
- 3 trust or profit within this state, unless:

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- 5 (iv) His rights as an elector are restored
- 6 pursuant to W.S.  $\frac{7-13-105(b)}{and}$  and  $\frac{(c)}{7-13-105(c)}$  and  $\frac{(f)}{and}$
- 7 in which case the person shall remain incompetent to be a
- 8 juror or to hold any office of honor, trust or profit
- 9 within this state.

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- 11 7-13-105. Certificate of restoration of rights;
- 12 procedure for restoration in general; procedure for
- 13 restoration of voting rights for nonviolent felonies;
- 14 filing requirements.

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- 16 (c) The department of corrections shall issue a
- 17 certificate of restoration of voting rights to eligible
- 18 persons eligible pursuant to subsection (f) of this section
- 19 as follows:

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- 21 (i) For persons convicted within Wyoming of a
- 22 nonviolent felony or nonviolent felonies arising out of the
- 23 same occurrence or related course of events who completed

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1 their sentence before January 1, 2010, the department shall

2 require receipt of a written request on a form prescribed

3 by the department and issue each eligible person a

4 certificate of restoration of voting rights following a

5 determination that the person has completed his sentence,

6 including probation and parole and payment of any fines and

7 restitution. The department shall not require an

8 application for restoration before issuing a certificate to

9 eligible persons who complete their sentence including

10 probation and parole and payment of any fines and

11 restitution on and after January 1, 2010;

and payment of any fines and restitution.

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(ii) For persons convicted outside of Wyoming or 13 under federal law of a nonviolent felony or nonviolent 14 15 felonies arising out of the same occurrence or related 16 course of events, the department shall issue each eligible 17 person a certificate of restoration of voting rights upon receipt of a written request on a form prescribed by the 18 19 department and following a determination that the person 20 has completed his sentence, including probation and parole

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1 (f) Voting rights lost pursuant to W.S. 6-10-106 for any nonviolent felony shall be deemed restored, with 2 respect to the nonviolent felony, upon the completion of 3 4 all of the person's sentence, including probation and parole, and payment of any fines and restitution arising 5 6 from the conviction of the nonviolent felony. 7 8 **Section 2.** W.S. 7-13-105(b) is repealed. 9 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2023. 10 11 12 (END)

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
