## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to district and county and prosecuting 2 attorneys; requiring each district attorney and county and 3 prosecuting attorney to be a licensed attorney and a member

4 in good standing with the Wyoming state bar during the term

5 of office for which the district attorney or county and

6 prosecuting attorney was elected or appointed; specifying

7 applicability; and providing for an effective date.

11 **Section 1**. W.S. 9-1-802(b) and 18-3-301(a) are

- 1 (b) Each district attorney shall have been a licensed
- 2 attorney for at least four (4) years and a member in good
- 3 standing of the Wyoming state bar immediately prior to his
- 4 election. Each district attorney shall be a licensed
- attorney and a member in good standing of the Wyoming state 5
- bar throughout the term of office for which the district 6
- attorney was elected or appointed. 7

- 18-3-301. Office created; qualifications; certificate 9
- 10 of election; counties empowered to consolidate.

11

- In judicial districts in which the office of 12
- district attorney has not been created there shall be 13
- elected in each county a county and prosecuting attorney 14
- who at the time of his nomination and election and during 15
- 16 his term of office, shall be a member in good standing of
- 17 the bar of this state. A copy of his certificate of
- election and oath shall be filed by the county and 18
- 19 prosecuting attorney with the clerk of the district court
- 20 for his county or counties. In those judicial districts in
- 21 which the office of district attorney has been created the
- county commissioners shall appoint an attorney to the 22
- 23 office of county attorney for a term of one (1) year, who

1 may be reappointed on a year-to-year basis. The county

2 commissioners may remove the county attorney for cause.

4 Section 2. This act shall apply to each district

5 attorney and county and prosecuting attorney whose term of

6 office begins on and after the effective date of this act.

7

8 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
