Brucellosis management updates.

## A BILL

## for

1 ACT relating to agriculture, livestock and other AN 2 animals; amending the requirement to distinctly brand a livestock animal following a positive brucellosis test to 3 be discretionary; updating the provisions for brucellosis 4 5 testing of cattle; modifying the documentation requirements б to receive compensation for brucellosis testing; requiring 7 rulemaking; and providing for effective dates. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-19-401 and 11-19-407(a) and (c) 11 12 are amended to read: 13 14 11-19-401. Tagging, branding and disposition of 15 cattle reacting to test; penalties for failure to comply.

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2 All livestock animals in Wyoming reacting to a confirmatory 3 for brucellosis (Bang's disease) shall may test be 4 immediately permanently branded with a hot iron letter "B" 5 on the left tailhead by or in the presence of an officially authorized veterinarian. All such reactor livestock animals 6 shall be disposed of for slaughter or diagnostic purposes 7 only, upon and according to written instruction from the 8 Wyoming livestock board. Any person who violates 9 any 10 provision of this section shall be punished as provided in 11 W.S. 11-1-103. As used in this section, "confirmatory test" 12 means a test for brucellosis that has the specificity and sensitivity to verify the presence or absence of brucella 13 abortus in animal serum or tissues and is used to confirm 14 results from an initial brucellosis test. 15

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## 17 **11-19-407.** Brucellosis testing program.

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19 The livestock board shall develop a brucellosis (a) 20 surveillance program in any designated surveillance area as 21 defined by the livestock board and any temporary 22 surveillance area of concern designated by the board and 23 approved by the governor as an area where risk of exposure

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1 to documented infected wildlife is of concern. The program 2 may be conducted with the help of veterinary practitioners 3 and livestock auction markets. This program shall provide 4 for the testing of livestock for brucellosis, for spaying heifers and for adult vaccinations only to the extent that 5 may be reasonably necessary to maintain or to regain the 6 brucellosis-free status of the 7 state of Wyoming. 8 Compensation under this program for all purposes except 9 mandatory testing or testing within an a temporary 10 surveillance area of concern as designated by the board and 11 approved by the governor shall be pursuant to the terms of 12 a livestock herd brucellosis mitigation plan that has been 13 entered into between the livestock producer and the Wyoming 14 state veterinarian.

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16 (C) Payments under subsection (b) of this section 17 shall be made monthly directly to accredited veterinarians who perform brucellosis testing, spaying, adult vaccinating 18 and surveillance planning or to livestock auction markets 19 20 that use their facilities and veterinarians to conduct 21 brucellosis testing, spaying or adult vaccinating as 22 mandated by rule of the Wyoming livestock board or the United States department of agriculture animal and plant 23

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1	and-health inspection service. The payment shall be made
2	upon <del>submission to <u>receipt</u> by</del> the Wyoming livestock board
3	of a notarized invoice indicating the number of head
4	tested, spayed or adult vaccinated, the ownership of the
5	animals tested, spayed or adult vaccinated and the testing,
6	spaying or adult vaccinating location documentation in the
7	format and manner specified by board rule.

9	Section 2. The Wyoming livestock board shall
10	promulgate all rules necessary to implement the provisions
11	of this act no later than July 1, 2023.

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15	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
16	section, this act is effective July 1, 2023.
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18	(b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective
19	immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a
20	bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of
21	the Wyoming Constitution.
