## A BILL

for

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iv) and 21-3-110(a)(xxv)

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11 are amended to read:

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13 21-2-304. Duties of the state board of education.

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15 (a) The state board of education shall:

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4	(IV) In Consultation with local school
3	districts, establish requirements for students to earn a
4	high school diploma as evidenced by course completion and
5	as measured by each district's assessment system prescribed
6	by rule and regulation of the state board and required
7	under W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxiv). The board shall also, in
8	consultation with local districts, establish requirements
9	by rule for students with disabilities as identified under
10	the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20
11	U.S.C. § 1400 et seq. to obtain a high school certificate
12	of completion to be issued by school districts. The
13	requirements to obtain a high school certificate of
14	completion shall be consistent with the student's
15	individual education program. Once every five (5) years and
16	on a staggered basis, the state board shall through the
17	department, review and approve each district's assessment
18	system designed to determine the various levels of student
19	performance as aligned with the uniform state standards and
20	the attainment of high school graduation requirements as
21	evidenced by course completion. In addition and following
22	review, refinement and revision of student content and
23	performance standards adopted under paragraph (a)(iii) of

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1	this section and reviewed under subsection (c) of this
2	section, the board shall establish a process to ensure
3	district assessment systems are aligned with the refined
4	and revised standards within three (3) full school years
5	following adoption of revised standards;

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9	(a) The board of trustees in each school district
10	shall:

12	(xxv) At minimum and on or before November 1 of
13	each school year, report to the department of education
14	evidence that the district is compliant with high school

17	completion requirements imposed by the state board under
18	W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iv);
