2	duty military members to transfer to any public school
3	within a school district as specified; requiring reporting;
4	making a conforming amendment; and providing for an
5	effective date.
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7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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9	Section 1. W.S. 21-4-302.2 is created to read:
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11	21-4-302.2. Enrollment and transfer for children of
12	active duty military members; discrimination.
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14	(a) As used in this section, "active duty military"
15	means full-time duty status in the active uniformed

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services of the United States. The term does not include
members of the national guard and reserve on active duty
orders.

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(b) Once enrolled in a public school within the 5 school district, any pupil whose parent or guardian is an 6 active duty military member may transfer enrollment from 7 8 one (1) public school within the school district where the pupil resides to another public school within the same 9 10 district at any time, except as otherwise provided in 11 subsection (c) of this section. A transfer of enrollment 12 under this subsection shall require that the active duty military member provide proof of having filed an official 13 complaint with a military base equal opportunity office 14 15 describing discrimination against the pupil seeking the 16 transfer of enrollment.

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18 (c) A school district may decline to transfer a pupil 19 seeking a transfer under this section in a particular 20 public school within the district for any of the following 21 reasons:

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1 (i) The particular public school's structure, 2 arrangement or function of rooms does not have sufficient 3 capacity including at the appropriate grade level; or 4 (ii) The pupil seeking a transfer of enrollment 5 has been suspended or expelled or is in the process of 6 being suspended or expelled under W.S. 21-4-305 through 7 8 21-4-306. 9 10 (d) Not later than ten (10) days after a school 11 district declines to transfer a pupil seeking a transfer under subsection (c) of this section, a school district 12 shall report its denial to the state superintendent of 13 public instruction. 14 15

16 (e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to 17 require a particular public school to offer additional 18 programs, alter the structure or equipment of the necessary 19 facilities to meet any special needs of a pupil, offer a 20 particular program or alter eligibility criteria for 21 participation in a particular program including age requirements, course prerequisites and required levels of 22 23 performance.

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2 (f) Any parent or guardian who is an active duty 3 military member aggrieved by a decision of the school 4 district under subsection (c) of this section, may seek review in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative 5 Procedure Act. In accordance with W.S. 16-3-112, the review б of a decision of the school district shall be before the 7 8 state superintendent of public instruction. If the school 9 district declines to transfer a pupil in a particular 10 public school under paragraph (c)(i) of this section, the state construction department shall submit a recommendation 11 12 regarding the particular public school's capacity to the state superintendent of public instruction. 13 14 Section 2.
