7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11	(a) The legislature finds that:

13	(i) In 2017, the legislature enacted W.S.
14	14-2-206, which provides that the liberty of a parent to

1 the care, custody and control of a parent's child is a fundamental right residing first in the parent; 2 3 4 (ii) Both before and after the enactment of that 5 statute, the legislature has always intended to protect the fundamental right of fit parents; 6 7 8 (iii) In recent years, Wyoming courts have not consistently applied W.S. 14-2-206 with W.S. 20-2-701, 9 10 which authorizes grandparent visitation. Courts have authorized grandparent visitation in cases where fit 11 12 parents have resisted grandparent visitation, leading to situations where the fundamental rights and decisions of 13 14 parents have given way to visitation requests by 15 grandparents;

(iv) W.S. 14-2-206 provides that the state, or any agency of the state, shall not infringe a parent's fundamental right without first demonstrating that the governmental interest as applied to the parent is a compelling state interest addressed by the least restrictive means;

2	(c) Prior to the hearing a copy of the petition to
3	adopt a child and an order to show cause shall be served on
4	any persons awarded visitation rights to the child under
5	W.S. 20-7-101 or 20-7-102. The consent of persons awarded
6	visitation rights to the adoption is not required. However,
7	the court may exercise its discretion to allow those
8	persons an opportunity to be heard if the court finds it to
9	be in the best interest and welfare of the child.
10	
11	Section 3. W.S. 20-7-101 is repealed.
12	
13	Section 4. Nothing in this act shall be construed to
14	affect visitation rights granted to grandparents before the
15	effective date of this act.
16	
17	Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon
18	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
19	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
20	Constitution.
