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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 Section 1. W.S. 21-2-705(c)(i) and (iii) and
- 12 21-2-706(b), (d)(intro), (e) and by creating a new

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13 subsection (g) are amended to read:

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15 **21-2-705.** Fund allocation.

1 (c) All funds received by the state from the federal 2 government pursuant to section 611(d) and reserved by the 3 pursuant to section 611(e)(2) of the 4 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act shall retained by the department of education for state level 5 activities authorized by federal law. The department of 6 education shall expend these amounts in accordance with the 7 8 following:

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10 (i) A per student allocation shall be determined by dividing the retained amount, less funds allowed to be 11 12 retained in the state's high risk pool under section 611(e)(3)(A) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities 13 Education Act, by the number of students aged three (3) 14 through twenty-one (21) years receiving special education 15 16 services on December May 1 of the preceding school year 17 immediately preceding the budget request;

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19 (iii) For purposes of this subsection, "children 20 aged three (3) through five (5) years receiving special 21 education services through the division" means the actual 22 number of students receiving services through the division

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         (b) For purposes of calculating payments to service
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    providers for the subsequent fiscal year and preparing the
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    division's budget request to the legislature, the division
    shall multiply the number of children age birth through
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    five (5) years of age with developmental disabilities who
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    are eligible for and placed on an individualized education
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    program or individualized family service plan through
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    developmental preschool services on or before December May
    1 of the school year in which immediately preceding the
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    budget request is being prepared by eight thousand five
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    hundred three dollars ($8,503.00) eleven thousand seven
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    hundred ninety-six dollars ($11,796.00) per child per year.
    Eligibility for developmental preschool services shall be
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determined by the state rules and regulations governing an

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individualized education program or an

21 family service plan.

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1 (d) The per child amount specified in subsection (b)
2 of this section shall be increased by the amount of three
3 hundred sixty-three dollars (\$363.00) five hundred four
4 dollars (\$504.00) to provide:
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6 (e) Commencing with the budget request for the fiscal

7 year $\frac{2010}{2026}$ and for each fiscal year thereafter, the

8 department shall prepare an exception budget request

9 necessary to adjust the amounts calculated pursuant to

10 subsections (b) and (d) of this section and as previously

11 adjusted pursuant to this subsection, to reflect the most

12 recent external cost adjustment enacted by the legislature

13 pursuant to W.S. 21-13-309(o). The intent of this

14 subsection is for each budget request to incorporate all

15 previous adjustments made pursuant to this subsection.

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g) For purposes of calculating payments to service providers made under this section for the subsequent fiscal year, if the per child amounts specified in this section would result in service providers receiving payments that are different from the available appropriation, the payments shall be adjusted on a pro rata basis so each service provider receives the same percentage of the per

For purposes of calculating payments to service providers under W.S. 21-2-705 and 21-2-706, as 5 amended by section 1 of this act, for the fiscal year 6 7 beginning July 1, 2024, the division shall multiply the 8 number of children age birth through five (5) years of age with developmental disabilities who are eligible for and 9 10 placed on an individualized education program or individualized family service plan through developmental 11
