**Catch Title:** **Newborn child safe havens-age of child.**

**Subject:** Relinquishment of newborn children to safe havens.

**Summary/Major Elements:**

- The purpose of Wyoming's newborn child safe haven statutes is to provide to a parent of a newborn child the means to relinquish the child so that the child may be cared for and protected in a safe haven. Safe haven providers include fire stations, hospitals, police departments, sheriff's offices and any other place of shelter and safety identified by the Department of Family Services.
- This act increases the age of a newborn child who may be relinquished to a safe haven provider from a child who is fourteen (14) days of age or younger (as determined within a reasonable degree of medical certainty) to a child who is sixty (60) days of age or younger (as determined within a reasonable degree of medical certainty).
