1 The United States department of agriculture and the (v) 2 animal and plant health inspection service have stated that a 3 seventy percent (70%) compliance rate with mandatory electronic 4 identification usage would be necessary to make the identification 5 program an effective disease traceability requirement; б 7 already has livestock (vi) Wyoming identification methods that are far superior to the mandatory electronic 8 9 identification rules that, according to the United States 10 agriculture and the animal and plant department of health 11 inspection service, are specifically targeted to apply to only eleven percent (11%) of all livestock in the country; and 12 13 14 (vii) The mandatory electronic identification rule was 15 put in place by a federal government agency rather than being voted on by the United States congress, making it only a rule and not 16 codified law. 17 18 19 It is the policy of the state of Wyoming that: (b) 20 21 Wyoming is opposed to the animal and plant health (i) 22 inspection service's rule mandating electronic identification 23 devices for Wyoming livestock; 24 25 (ii) W.S. 11-18-117 clearly defines the terms by which the Wyoming livestock industry can continue to do business and 26 27 have the freedom, right and liberty to use historically reliable, 28 affordable, confidential and voluntary methods of livestock identification, including brands, backtags, tattoos and ear tags; 29 30 31 (iii) Wyoming will seek to work with existing metal manufacturers 32 identification taq to produce those tags historically used to confirm livestock health and identity; 33 34 35 Wyoming is committed to working with other states (iv) to develop agreements and arrangements to allow livestock to be 36 37 transported to and from Wyoming without being required to use 38 electronic identification ear tags; 39 40 Wyoming shall demand that the United (v) States department of agriculture and the animal and plant 41 health inspection service provide a complete and full accounting and 42 43 accurate estimate of all costs associated with mandating that Wyoming's livestock producers use electronic identification ear 44 tags, including costs associated with hardware, software, ear 45 tags, wands, retrofitting of livestock handling facilities, 46 47 retrofitting of sales barns, working of livestock and costs related

to additional paperwork, digital input and filings necessary to prove compliance with the electronic identification ear tag rule to the Wyoming legislature.".
