A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to concealed weapons; repealing gun free zones; providing for the carrying of concealed weapons as specified; creating a criminal offense for prohibiting entry to a person carrying a concealed weapon as specified; clarifying that only the state legislature may regulate firearms, weapons and ammunition; providing for exceptions; requiring rulemaking; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1**. W.S. 6-8-105 is created to read:

1 6-8-105. Exceptions for state issued concealed carry 2 permits; penalty. 3 4 (a) This section shall be known as and may be cited as the "Wyoming Repeal Gun Free Zones Act." 5 6 7 (b) Persons lawfully carrying concealed weapons in 8 Wyoming under W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii) through (iv) may carry a 9 concealed weapon in the following places: 10 (i) Any meeting of a governmental entity; 11 12 13 (ii) Any meeting of the legislature or a 14 committee thereof; 15 16 (iii) Any public building not otherwise 17 prohibited under W.S. 6-8-104(t) or regulated under this 18 section. 19 (c) Persons lawfully carrying concealed weapons in 20 Wyoming with a permit issued under W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii) may 21 22 carry a concealed weapon in the following places:

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1	(i) Any public school, public college or
2	university athletic event taking place on public property
3	that does not sell alcoholic beverages;
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5	(ii) Any public elementary or secondary school
6	facility;

8	(iii) Any public college or university facility.

10	(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
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12	(i) Allow the carrying of a concealed weapon
13	where otherwise prohibited under W.S. 6-8-104(t);
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15	(ii) Prohibit a private property owner from
16	restricting firearms on his private property;
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18	(iii) Prohibit a governmental entity from
19	prohibiting the open carry, display or wearing of a firearm
20	in its facilities or on its campus;
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22	(iv) Allow the carrying of a concealed weapon
23	into facilities where otherwise prohibited by law;

(v) Allow the carrying of a concealed weapon within state agency operated health and human services settings, health and human services facilities that are licensed by the department of family services or department of corrections or health and human services facilities that are certified by the behavioral health division of the

department of health to provide residential services;

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(vi) Allow the carrying of a concealed weapon within any facility where explosive or volatile materials are present. For purposes of this paragraph "explosive or volatile materials" shall not include materials that are either in an insufficient amount or in a form such that the material could not reasonably cause serious bodily injury due to the materials explosive or volatile nature;

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(vii) Prohibit a governmental entity from requiring any employee or student to store firearms within a concealed biometric container or locking container when not being carried on the employee's or student's person, except said rules shall not:

1	(A)	Prohibit	the	storage	of	firearms	and

2 ammunition in public campus housing by any employee or

3 student authorized to carry a concealed firearm pursuant to

4 this section; or

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6 (B) Require that a firearm be stored

7 unloaded or separate from its ammunition.

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9 (e) Any person who knowingly prohibits entry to

10 another person for lawfully carrying a concealed weapon

11 into a place authorized pursuant to subsection (b) or (c)

12 of this section, unless otherwise prohibited under

13 subsection (d) of this section, when the person would

14 otherwise be permitted entry is guilty of a misdemeanor

15 punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year,

16 a fine of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00),

17 or both.

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19 (f) The board of trustees in each school district may

20 adopt rules and regulations to govern employees lawfully

21 carrying concealed weapons in Wyoming under W.S. 6-8-104 on

22 or in any property or facility owned or leased by the

23 school district. If no rules and regulations are adopted

- 1 under this subsection, an employee with a permit to conceal
- 2 carry under W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii) may carry a concealed
- 3 weapon under W.S. 6-8-105(c)(ii) or (iii) onto school
- 4 property. Any rules and regulations adopted under this
- 5 subsection shall only apply to persons who are employees,
- 6 as defined by subsection (g) of this section. The rules
- 7 under this subsection shall:

- 9 (i) Require any person carrying a firearm
- 10 pursuant to this section to maintain the firearm on his
- 11 person at all times or in a concealed biometric container
- 12 or lock box within the direct control of the person at all
- 13 times;

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- 15 (ii) Establish ongoing training requirements,
- 16 curricula and instructor qualifications, in consultation
- 17 with local law enforcement, including:

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- 19 (A) An initial course of training comprised
- 20 of not less than sixteen (16) hours of live fire handgun
- 21 training, and eight (8) hours of scenario based training

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22 using nonlethal training, firearms and ammunition; and

1	(B) Annual firearm qualification and
2	documented recurrent training of not less than twelve (12)
3	hours with an approved instructor.
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5	(g) For purposes of subsection (f) of this section,
6	"employee" means any person employed by a school district,
7	including but not limited to, superintendents, assistant
8	superintendents, principals, assistant principals,
9	teachers, guidance counselors, librarians, teacher's aids,
10	coaches, business managers, secretaries or administrative
11	assistants, janitors, bus drivers or other employees of a
12	school district.

14	(h) The board of trustees in any school district may
15	waive all or part of the training requirements of paragraph
16	(f)(ii) of this section for isolated rural schools and
17	employees in those schools.
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19	Section 2. W.S. 6-8-401(c) is amended to read:
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21	6-8-401. Firearm, weapon and ammunition regulation
22	and prohibition by state.

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         (c) The sale, transfer, purchase, delivery, taxation,
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    manufacture, ownership, transportation, storage, use and
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    possession of firearms, weapons and ammunition shall be
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    authorized, regulated and prohibited by the state, and
    regulation thereof is preempted by the legislature of the

    state
         of Wyoming. Except as authorized
                                                    by W.S.
    15-1-103(a)(xviii) and \frac{21-3-132}{23-1-302}, no state agency
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    or entity, city, town, county, political subdivision or any
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    other entity shall authorize, regulate or prohibit the
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    sale, transfer, purchase, delivery, taxation, manufacture,
    ownership, transportation, storage, use,
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                                                 carrying
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    possession of firearms, weapons, accessories, components or
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    ammunition except as specifically provided by this chapter.
    This section shall not affect zoning or other ordinances
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    which encompass firearms businesses along with other
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    businesses. Zoning and other ordinances which are designed
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    for the purpose of restricting or prohibiting the sale,
    purchase, transfer or manufacture of firearms or ammunition
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    as a method of regulating firearms or ammunition are in
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    conflict with this section and are prohibited.
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Section 3. W.S. 6-8-104(t)(iv) through (vi), (ix) and

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23 (x) and 21-3-132 are repealed.

Section 4. The state building commission shall begin 2

promulgating any rules necessary to administer this act not 3

4 later than thirty (30) days after the effective date of

5 this act.
