A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to common law, statutes and rules of 2 construction; specifying definitions and standards for the 3 application of a person's biological sex in law, rules or 4 regulations; providing for the law to distinguish between 5 accommodations for males and females; requiring the collection of vital statistics and other data to identify 6 persons as male or female at birth; and providing for an 7 effective date. 8

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 **Section 1.** W.S. 8-1-110 is created to read:

13

- 8-1-110. References to males and females; separate
- 2 accommodations for males and females; data reporting
- 3 requirements.

- 5 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, with
- 6 respect to the application of a person's biological sex
- 7 under any law or rule and regulation in this state, the
- 8 following definitions and standards shall apply:

- 10 (i) A person's "sex" means the person's
- 11 biological sex, either male or female, at birth;

- 13 (ii) "Female" means a person who has, had, will
- 14 have or would have had, but for a congenital anomaly or
- 15 intentional or unintentional disruption, the reproductive
- 16 system that at some point produces, transports and utilizes
- 17 eggs for fertilization;

- 19 (iii) "Male" means a person who has, had, will
- 20 have or would have had, but for a congenital anomaly or
- 21 intentional or unintentional disruption, the reproductive
- 22 system that at some point produces, transports and utilizes

23 sperm for fertilization;

2	(iv) The terms "woman" and "girl" refer to human
3	females, and the terms "man" and "boy" refer to human
4	males;
5	
6	(v) "Mother" means a parent of the female sex;
7	
8	(vi) "Father" means a parent of the male sex;
9	
10	(vii) With respect to biological sex, the term
11	"equal" does not mean "same" or "identical";
12	
13	(viii) With respect to biological sex, separate
14	accommodations are not inherently unequal; and
15	
16	(ix) A person born with a medically recognized
17	condition of a disorder or difference in sex development
18	shall be provided legal protections and accommodations
19	afforded under the Americans with Disabilities Act, as
20	amended, and any other applicable Wyoming law.
21	
22	(b) The legislature finds that laws, rules and
23	regulations that distinguish between the sexes are subject

- 1 to intermediate constitutional scrutiny. Intermediate
- 2 constitutional scrutiny forbids unfair discrimination
- 3 against similarly situated male and female persons but
- 4 allows the law to distinguish between the sexes where such
- 5 distinctions are substantially related to important
- 6 governmental objectives.

7

- 8 (c) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 9 contrary, laws, rules and regulations that recognize or
- 10 enforce distinctions between the sexes with respect to
- 11 athletics, prisons or other detention facilities, domestic
- 12 violence shelters, rape crisis centers, locker rooms,
- 13 restrooms and other areas where safety or privacy are
- 14 implicated and that result in separate accommodations
- 15 between the sexes are substantially related to the
- 16 important governmental objectives of protecting the health,
- 17 safety and privacy of persons in such circumstances.

18

- 19 (d) Any school district, or public school thereof,
- 20 and any state agency, department, office or other political
- 21 subdivision that collects vital statistics for the purpose
- 22 of complying with anti-discrimination laws or for the
- 23 purpose of gathering accurate public health, crime

1 economic or other data shall identify each person who is

2 part of the collected data set as either male or female

3 consistent with the persons sex at birth.

5 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon

6 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

7 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

8 Constitution.
